Let's listen in to what the Holy Spirit has in store for us today...

WHAT IS THIS LOVE? “FOR GOD SO *LOVED*...”

SCRIPTURAL SENSES OF GOD’S LOVE:

- Love that is internal to the Persons of the Holy Trinity in which they love one another

- Love that God externalizes towards his creatures

THIS “EXTERNAL” LOVE IS FURTHER DISTINGUISHED:

- God’s universal love for all the things he’s made (Gen. 1:31; Ps. 104:31; Ps. 136:25; Prov. 8:20–31)

- God’s general love for all human beings (Job 36:24–31; Acts 14:17; Matt. 5:43–45)

- God’s special love for his elect people (Eph. 1:4–5)

THE SOURCE OF THIS LOVE: “FOR *GOD* SO *LOVED*...”

THE NATURE OF THIS LOVE: “FOR *THUS* GOD *LOVED*...”
