A WORD TO VISITORS ABOUT THE LORD'S SUPPER

The *Lord's Supper* is also known as *Holy Communion*, because it is a time in which we enjoy fellowship with our Lord. It is also a time in which we enjoy fellowship with him together as believers.

As a visible expression of our unity in Christ here as a local congregation, our elders have certain requirements to help them reasonably to be assured that you are like-minded with us. If you are not a communicant member of our congregation, we welcome you to this Table if:

1. You have been baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
2. You are displeased with yourself and repentant because of your sins.
3. You trust that your sins are forgiven by Jesus Christ alone.
4. You desire more and more to live a godly life.
5. You are a member and are not currently under church discipline of a Protestant church, which preaches that sinners are saved by God's grace alone, through faith alone, in Jesus Christ alone, and which practices church discipline.

If this does not describe you or if you do not understand what this is all about, we ask you to please abstain today. Since we desire to welcome you at the Lord's Table please speak with Pastor Danny or one of our elders after the service to discuss your relationship with Christ and his Church.
