THE REFORMED CHURCH

Last week we considered Sola Fide –Faith Alone–and saw that faith is the only instrument by which we are justified and made right before a holy God. But if we are justified by faith alone, where does that faith come from? The Reformers answered with another biblical truth: **Sola Gratia–Grace Alone.**

Scripture teaches that salvation is God's gift from beginning to end. We are not saved because we earn God's favor, cooperate our way into His grace, or make ourselves worthy of salvation. Rather, God graciously saves sinners who could never save themselves. Even the faith by which we receive Christ is itself the result of God's gracious work in us. As Paul writes, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God" (Ephesians 2:8).

The Reformers believed that over time the medieval church had obscured this truth through a series of theological accretions. While Rome affirmed the necessity of grace, it increasingly connected the reception of grace to the church's sacramental system and the believer's cooperation with that grace in order to attain justification.

The Reformers returned to the teaching of Scripture and insisted that salvation is wholly of grace. If salvation ultimately rests upon what we contribute, then grace is no longer grace. But if salvation is God's gift from beginning to end, then all glory belongs to Him alone.

Sola Gratia reminds us that our salvation is not the result of what we have done for God, but of what God has done for us in Christ.
