THE REFORMED CHURCH

Over the past two weeks we have considered **Sola Fide**—Faith Alone—and **Sola Gratia**—Grace Alone. We are saved by grace alone through faith alone. But faith must have an object. The Reformers answered with another biblical truth: **Solus Christus—Christ Alone.**

Scripture teaches that Jesus Christ is the only mediator between God and man and the only Savior of sinners. His perfect life, sacrificial death, and victorious resurrection are fully sufficient to accomplish our salvation. As Paul writes, "For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (1 Timothy 2:5).

The Reformers believed that over time the medieval church had obscured the unique sufficiency of Christ. While affirming Christ as Savior, the church also encouraged believers to seek the intercession of saints, venerate Mary in ways the Reformers believed exceeded Scripture, and rely upon the authority of the church's magisterium alongside Christ's mediatorial work.

The Reformers returned to Scripture and insisted that Christ alone is our Prophet, Priest, and

King. We need no other mediator, no additional priesthood, and no supplementary source of merit. Everything necessary for our salvation is found in Him.

Solus Christus reminds us that our hope rests not in saints, church leaders, or our own works, but in Jesus Christ alone, who is able to save completely those who come to God through Him.

THE 1689 LONDON BAPTIST CATECHISM

Question #80. What is the Lord's Supper?

A. The Lord's Supper is an ordinance of the New Testament, instituted by Jesus Christ; wherein, by giving and receiving bread and wine, according to his appointment, his death is shown forth, and the worthy receivers are, not after a corporeal and carnal manner, but by faith, made partakers of his body and blood, with all his benefits, to their spiritual nourishment, and growth in grace.
