THE REFORMED CHURCH

Our church identifies as a Reformed Baptist church. One way to understand what that means is by looking at the Five Solas of the Reformation—five biblical truths that helped define the Protestant Reformation and continue to shape Reformed churches today.

The first is **Sola Fide**, or **Faith Alone**.

At the heart of this doctrine is a simple but vital question: **How can a sinner be declared righteous before a holy God?** During the Reformation, the Reformers became convinced that the church of their day had obscured the biblical answer. Rome taught that justification involved not only faith, but also participation in the sacramental life of the church and growth in personal righteousness. Faith was necessary, but faith alone was not enough.

The Reformers pointed back to Scripture. They argued that sinners are justified before God solely on the basis of Christ's righteousness, received through faith alone. Good works are the fruit of salvation, but they do not contribute to our right standing before God. As Paul writes, "For we conclude that a person is justified by faith apart from the works of the law"(Romans 3:28).

This doctrine was so important that many Reformers considered it the heart of the gospel itself. Our hope

before God rests not in our performance, but in the perfect obedience, atoning death, and victorious resurrection of Jesus Christ. Through faith, His righteousness is counted as ours.

The doctrine of justification by faith alone remains one of the defining convictions of Reformed churches because we believe it faithfully summarizes the teaching of Scripture and preserves the glory of Christ as the only ground of our salvation.

Throughout the summer, we will continue considering what it means to be a Reformed church. From the Solas of the Reformation to covenant theology, confessionalism, and the doctrines of grace, we will seek to understand why these convictions matter and how they arise from the teaching of Scripture.

THE 1689 LONDON BAPTIST CATECHISM

Question #78. How is baptism rightly administered?

A. Baptism is rightly administered by immersion, or dipping the whole body of the person in water, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, according to Christ's institution, and the practice of the apostles, and not by sprinkling or pouring of water, or dipping some part of the body, after the tradition of men.
