

Revival in the Ruins! (Part 10) - **Going Deeper Questions**

Question #1: What in your life is quietly competing with your devotion to Jesus right now? Where have you become comfortable with something that God has been asking you to confront? Are you blending in with the world more than you are being set apart for God? What “weight” (not just sin) is slowing down your spiritual growth?

Question #2: Have you truly repented, or have you just felt bad about your sin? What sin have you been minimizing, renaming, or excusing? Are there patterns in your life that trace back to family or generational habits that need to be broken? When was the last time you gave God unhurried, honest confession? What would it take to do so now?

Question #3: Where have you forgotten what God has already done in your life? How has God been faithful to you, even when you weren't faithful to Him? Do you focus more on your failures or on God's mercy? Why is this the case? What would change in your life if you truly believed God is still faithful right now?

Question #4: Is there any area of your life that you are still holding back from God? Have you made partial commitments instead of full surrender? What would it look like for you to say, “God, I'm not going back” in a real, tangible way? If nothing changes in your current posture, where will your life be in a year? Where would you like your life to be in a year?

Question #5: Are you more focused on fixing what's around you or what's within you? Have you mistaken activity for intimacy with God? Are you positioned for revival or just maintaining routine?

Challenge:

1. Identify and remove one distraction this week. Don't generalize. Get specific.
2. Set aside 30–60 minutes this week with no distractions: Read Scripture, confess specifically, pray like David in Psalm 51, and sit in God's presence.
3. Write down a personal statement to God: “God, I'm surrendering _____.” “I'm not going back to _____.” “From this day forward, I choose _____.” Date stamp this commitment and stick with it!
