

Everyone Has a Wall (Part 4)- Going Deeper Questions

Question #1: When have you seen a need but hesitated to step in? What held you back? When reading Nehemiah 3, why do you think God chose to record the names of so many ordinary people involved in building the wall? What does this chapter reveal about how God accomplishes big tasks through many small acts of obedience?

Question #2: Why was rebuilding the wall so important for the people of Jerusalem spiritually and socially? What do you notice about how the people worked side by side throughout the chapter? How does the idea that everyone has a role challenge the idea that ministry is only for pastors or church leaders? Why do you think God chooses to accomplish His work through many people rather than just a few leaders? What happens to a church when people choose not to build their section of the wall?

Question #3: When you hear the phrase “Everyone has a wall,” what area of your life immediately comes to mind? What gifts, abilities, or experiences has God given you that could be used to help build His church? Have you ever felt like your contribution to God’s work was too small to matter? What does this passage say about that mindset?

Question #4: Why do you think enthusiasm is so important when serving God? What are some ways people can begin serving with the wrong attitude? How can we guard against that? How does remembering that we are ultimately serving the Lord and not people change our perspective?

Question #5: Imagine what God could do if every person in the church stepped fully into their assignment. What might that look like? What legacy could be built for the next generation if we faithfully build our wall today? How can we help the next generation discover their purpose and place in building God’s church?

Challenge:

1. Take the time this week to prayerfully discover the wall God is calling you to.
2. Take one step toward your wall this week. I.e: sign up for Grow Track, Step into a Serve Team, Begin to give financially to the mission of the church, etc.
3. Take time this week to reflect on how you are serving God. Ask yourself:
 - Am I serving out of obligation or enthusiasm?
 - Am I giving God my best effort?
