Book Recycling Coming Soon

Are your bookshelves groaning and overstacked? Are you looking for some new titles for these long summer days? Here's what you can do:

Clean out your bookshelves to make room for new books. Then come to St Stephen's Book Sale, July 26 and 27.

Here's how it works: Starting Monday, July 21, you can bring books to be recycled to the Community Hall. On Friday, July 25, volunteers (this could be you!) will sort the books into general categories on tables in the loggia and down the halls. The sale will be open to the public on Saturday, July 26 from 9-2 pm. The books will remain out on Sunday, July 27, and then will be boxed up and donated. Proceeds from the book sale will be split between the Little Free Pantry and the SSUMC Music Programs.

What to bring: paperbacks, hardbacks, coffee table books, children's books, audiobooks. Textbooks generally do not sell, so consider donating them elsewhere. Please do NOT bring VHS tapes.

A sign-up sheet will be posted in July for volunteers to set up and work the book sale. Friday evening volunteers also get first crack at choosing books! If you are so inclined, baked goods donated on Saturday can also be sold to shoppers.

From the Pastor:

Jesus often calls us to places we aren't always ready to go, challenging our comfort zones and inviting us into deeper transformation. This can feel unsettling, especially when the path ahead seems unclear or demands more of us than we feel capable of giving.

From a United Methodist perspective, this "calling" isn't about rigid adherence to ancient doctrines or a narrow interpretation of holiness. Instead, it's an ongoing invitation to grow in love, justice, and compassion, both individually and collectively. It's a call to embrace discomfort as growth, live into radical inclusivity, and engage in ongoing transformation.

So, when Jesus calls us to a place we're not quite ready for, lean into the discomfort, knowing that God's Spirit is guiding us toward a more expansive and just expression of faith.
