Candlelight Vigil for Immigrants—Date change

An Immigrant Vigil will be held Tuesday, September 9, 7:30-8:00 pm in the sanctuary. The vigil is for the St. Stephen's community to grieve together for all immigrants, and especially for our refugee families. Immigration policies dramatically changed this year to be harsh and unwelcoming. Most disturbing is explaining to the refugee youth why they need to know what a red card is (explanation of immigrant rights) and why, as teens, they or their parent may not come home tonight due to an ICE encounter. NCRS volunteers came to know our families very well. The immigrant families and our volunteers thought that they were safe. While the message of concern is softer for those with green cards (Afghans), the message is most direct for our Hispanic families. Volunteers shared their love, their calling, and built trust among the NCRS families that they were safe and that the American society is built in part on trust and that someday those parents. those children could join us and become U.S. citizens and trust in a government that stood by it's protections. Now they see attempts to exclude them. We are heartbroken and grieve individually. We feel a tug to grieve together. We are an immigrant nation and it's important to remember those roots.

The NCRS has developed a preparedness plan for our families with guidance and limited protections, but that plan is only good until it's not and detention occurs without due process.

We want to take a moment, in humility to pause, to hold a vigil, and quietly acknowledge the potentially dire situation of our immigrants in this troubled time. To honor the dignity, the humanity, and the love of God for all immigrants. We want to sense the immigrant fear, feel God's cry, feel God lament with us, together, in one sacred place, and grieve for our immigrants.

Please join us for an Immigrant Vigil on September 9th in the Sanctuary.
