Candlelight Vigil for Immigrants

Join us in the sanctuary Tuesday evening, the 9th of September from 7:30—8:00 pm for a candlelight vigil for our immigrant community. There will be readings, prayers, candle lighting and music by Liam Carr. We welcomed refugees into our safe spaces. Now, they are fearful of a maligned immigration policy that threatens their future. Together, we will honor the immigrant journey and grieve for their fear. Please join us.



Two Immigrant Stories

Immigration is dangerous now in the U.S., especially without a green card.

Mohammad and Jose (names changed for confidentiality) and their families each came to Norman as refugees 4 and 2 years ago and represent two of many paths of immigration. Both families left behind important relationships with family and friends built in a young lifetime. Both families hope one day to become U.S. citizens. NCRS resettled their families in Norman. They both represent relative success stories in the U.S. immigration system. . . they are not yet deported!

Mohammad helped the U.S. Army Special Forces in Afghanistan in combat, undercover and Afghan translations for the U.S. troops in the war against the Taliban. He and his family were air lifted to the U.S. in August 2021. Within three months of arriving he (through an attorney) applied for his Afghan visa and received his work permit. His visa was approved six months later and a year after that he and his family had their green cards, Permanent Resident Authorization. Green card holders can apply for citizenship after five years. Mohammad and his family have three years to go! The U.S. Administration has considered revoking the Afghan visas and green cards.

Jose met his partner and future wife in Venezuela after she had been persecuted by the local government. They fled their home in Venezuela with his family to find safety and work in the coffee fields of neighboring Colombia. The kids were in school and they had jobs and this worked well, until violent drug activity got too close to Jose when one night his cousin was murdered. They decided Jose would find a place in the U.S. and she would follow with the children. He traveled through the dangerous Darien Gap in Panama and made his way to the U.S. border and obtained entry documents. The NCRS accepted Jose, and his family followed three months later. Because Jose entered the U.S. during a certain window of time, he was eligible for a special visa called a Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for Venezuelans. His wife entered the U.S. after the close of that window of time for the TPS and so applied for asylum with a court date four years out. Four months after her U.S. entry, Jose and his wife married in a beautiful wedding at their church in Norman. With the new U.S. administration, the immigration rules in place when Jose entered the U.S. changed. Along with 350,000 Venezuelans, Jose's TPS was revoked, canceled, and Jose was left with no status. He now awaits his wife's asylum approval before he can be added to her asylum case. If asylum approval is obtained, they can then apply for green cards, if they are not deported in the meantime!

Meanwhile, the NCRS continues to integrate Jose and his family into the social systems in Norman. Mohammad "graduated" from the NCRS program and has since moved out of Norman due to a job change . These are two immigrant stories of families living under different threats.
