- Expanded Ministry: Sunday Night Live is moving to a weekly schedule, and we are thrilled to be hiring a Children's Music Minister to pour into our youngest disciples.
- The Platinum Rule: Mark your calendars for February 7th and 8th. We are honored to host Rebekah Simon Peter, who will lead us in her transformative "Platinum Rule" class on Saturday and Sunday afternoon.
