OLD TESTAMENT READING Ezekiel 34:11-16, 20-24 "For thus says the Lord GOD: Behold, I, I myself will search for my sheep and will seek them out. 12 As a shepherd seeks out his flock when he is among his sheep that have been scattered, so will I seek out my sheep, and I will rescue them from all places where they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. 13 And I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land. And I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the ravines, and in all the inhabited places of the country. 14 I will feed them with good pasture, and on the mountain heights of Israel shall be their grazing land. EPISTLE 1 Corinthians 15:20-28

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. 21 For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. 22 For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. 23 But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. 24 Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power. 25 For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. 26 The last enemy to be destroyed is death. 27 For "God has put all things in subjection under his feet." HOLY GOSPEL Matthew 25:31-46

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. 32 Before him will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. 33 And he will place the sheep on his right, but the goats on the left. 34 Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. 35 For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, 36 I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick

and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.' 37 Then the righteous will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? 38 And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? 39 And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?' 40 And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.' 41 "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. 42 For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, 43 I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not clothe me, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' 44 Then they also will answer, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to you?' 45 Then he will answer them, saying, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' 46 And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life." ADVENT WREATH

The Advent Wreath has been part of the Christmas tradition since the 15th century. It has its origin in Germany. Its circle represents the eternal unchanging nature of God's love. The candles, each lit in succession to anticipate the coming of Jesus the Christ Child, the promised savior of the world.

On the first Sunday in Advent (the word advent is a Latin word meaning coming), the first purple candle is lit. Purple is a royal color, as well the color of humility and reflection, for Advent is a quiet time of waiting.

The meaning of the candles is as follows:

<u>First Sunday - Prophecy Candle.</u> There were many statements made in the Old Testament about the coming of Jesus prior to His birth. [Check out Isaiah 7:14 and 9:6-7, as well as Micah 5:2.]

Second Sunday - Second Coming Candle. Just as there were prophecies made that indicated the first coming of Jesus born as a baby in Bethlehem would take place, so there are those prophecies that indicate that the now ascended Jesus will come again. His second coming will bring the world, as we know it, to an end, hence the warnings that appear in the Bible to always be prepared for it by believing and trusting in Jesus as our Savior. [Check out 2 Peter 3:10-14 and Mark 13:33-37.]

<u>Third Sunday - Joy Candle.</u> The third Sunday in Advent is the pink candle symbolizing joy and happiness while we wait in joyful expectation. [Check out Philippians 4:4.]

<u>Fourth Sunday - Fulfillment or Faith Candle.</u> What God says WILL happen, DOES happen. [Check out Romans 5:1-11.]

Christmas! - The white Christ candle is lit on Christmas. The center white candle symbolizes the perfect sacrifice, and God's promise to wash away all sins by the sending of the Savior Jesus. [Check out 2 Corinthians 5:21.]
