



#### PLANNING COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS - OCT 15, 2025

**Parish Education and Preschool Report:** The Playground Grant project is complete. Enrollment 9 Full-time, 4 Part-time. Confirmation: 5 students. Jill has stepped down as Admin of Preschool while Pastor David Hardin has been asked by Council to take over the admin duties.

Properties Report, Dale Crisp: Now is the season for tree trimming and bats eviction. Paint quote of \$10k pending. Due to the new fencing, the sprinkler lines need to be fixed, plus many valves leaking. Sprinklers can be turned off during the rainy season. Courtyard sidewalk seams need to be filled/leveled. 7 bulbs are out in church. Discussed the garden plot maintenance with volunteers.

**Elder's Report, Andrew Hall:** Advent scheduled. Search continues for vacant Elder's slots. Regarding 2026 proposed budget, a 2.5% COLA was recommended by the District for 2026.

**Pastor's Report:** Confirmation classes start, many newcomers, baptisms, new members class.

**Congregation Voter's Meeting, Doug Van Camp:** Proposed the agenda for the next Congregation Voter's Meeting. The Elder's are considering a 2.5% COLA as recommended by the District for 2026.

This half-day gathering brings together congregations and ministries from across Northern California to share mission stories, strengthen partnerships, and inspire local outreach.

Weekly Ministry Outreach – Five Sacramento Locations Throughout November, our mobile ministry teams will continue serving at five weekly locations across Sacramento, providing showers, haircuts, hygiene kits, clothing, and prayer for our homeless neighbors. We thank God for the volunteers and donors who make this consistent outreach possible.

Friday, November 8 – Community Haircut Outreach We've been invited by a local Sacramento veterinary nonprofit organization to provide free haircuts for participants and volunteers at their one-day service event. Our faithful barber, Shaun Stockers, will be representing Mercy Holistic Ministry and sharing Christ's love through his gifts and joyful service.

Sunday, November 16 – I have been invited to preach at First Lutheran Church in Placerville, where our team will also display our mobile shower trailer and lead a Bible study following the worship service.
