

# Summer Camp COVID-19 Procedures

(Last Updated 4/8/2021)

To minimize the chance Coronavirus enters Oil Belt this summer, here are some procedures we are asking our staff, faculty, campers and their families to practice with us. Thank you for your assistance to help us make camp the best it can be with what we can do!

## Simple guidance that will limit the risk of transmission that we ask all to follow is:

- Washing your hands often and follow CDC recommended procedures.
- Follow the “cohort model” where campers will be in groups of 30. These groups will maintain distance and not intermix with other cohorts.
- Since campers will be in “cohorts”, they will only need to wear masks when in close proximity to other cohorts/people. We recommend campers/faculty bring 2 masks for each day they’ll be at camp.
- Cover your mouth for coughs, sneezes, etc.
- If you have symptoms of COVID-19, please stay home and follow CDC guidance. Staff, Faculty & Campers exhibiting symptoms upon arrival will not be allowed to enter that session, full refunds will be provided at this point.

If staff, faculty or campers exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 during camp then parents/guardians will be contacted and the suspected case will be required to go home. There will be no refunds for campers who exhibit symptoms of covid or are required to be sent home for covid exposure / quarantine.

## Additional camp guidelines we ask our staff, faculty and campers to abide by are:

- Students will be assigned to groups of 25 students and 5 adults. Currently, vaccinated individuals do not count towards capacity limits so group sizes may increase if attendees are vaccinated. Our deans are adapting camp to keep these groups to maintain separation from other groups throughout the camp session.
- Packages and mail will not be allowed to be sent to campers. If received, we will give it to the camper at check-out.
- Visitors are not allowed during camp sessions.
- If campers leave campus, for any reason, they will not be allowed to return to camp.
- There will be no off-site travel for campers this year. In past, there were field trips or mission portions where campers served in the community. These will not be allowed this year.

\*\*Off-site camps like wilderness will be following camping guidelines.

Our commitment to you is that Oil Belt Christian Service Camp will strive to fulfill our mission to *Make Disciples of Jesus Christ through the Teaching of God’s Word* while providing a safe, clean and fun environment! The 3 pillars of Worship, Bible Teaching and Small Group Community comprise of a great camp experience. You can trust the Staff, Deans and Faculty of Oil Belt are going to do their best to keep those pillars this year!

Last, these guidelines are changing often. 1-2 weeks before your camp session you will receive an updated list of guidance and procedures. Thank you for your flexibility, patience and understanding as we adapt camp to these ever-changing protocols.
