

The ceremony will begin at 4:30pm with words, prayers, and laying of wreath on the Rev. Joseph B. Lapsley vault. Following the ceremony, folks may walk across the street to La Gala in preparation for the banquet festivities...

A NOTE FOR OUR 200 CELEBRATION - 90% chance of thunderstorms on Sunday but really, who can forecast Kentucky weather accurately? **If it is raining at 4:30**, the Pioneer Cemetery program will be held at La Gala. Parking is available on the street, small lots near venue, parking structure, and behind SKYPAC.

Following our meal, we move to the sanctuary to pick up our worship time around the Last Supper (including stripping of the church). Reservations for dinner are required by NOON Tuesday April 16. Our menu: Rosemary Roasted Chicken, Sweet and Sour Beef Brisket, Candied Carrots, Roasted Beets, Asparagus, Passover Apple Squares. \$10 per adult, \$6 for youth/child, \$25 family max (one or two adult and children under 18). If you don't wish to eat, you are welcome to come for worship (which does begin at 6:00pm!).

GOOD FRIDAY WORSHIP will occur on Friday, April 19th at 12:00 noon in our Sanctuary. All are welcome, come by and bring a friend or co-worker.

EASTER BREAKFAST: Join us for fellowship over breakfast on Easter Sunday, April 21. Breakfast will be served beginning at 8:30 (It immediately follows the 7:30am Sunrise Service) and conclude at 10:00am. SUNDAY SCHOOL IS ON BREAK.
