The mosaic of Jonah being swallowed by a fish was found in the excavation of a synagogue in Huqoq, in the region of Galilee in Israel. It dates from the 5<sup>th</sup> century C.E.

For Young Worshipers: The fish is about to swallow Jonah. Jonah's shield won't save him. Only God can do that!
