

In many churches, the Sunday after Pentecost is Trinity Sunday.

Perichoresis (from Greek: περιχώρησις, "rotation") refers to the relationship of the three persons of the Trinity. The term implies a dance, or a lively conversation in which the persons of the Trinity interact. The Christian community may be understood as an analogy for the Trinity, sharing in the depth of divine love, in constant conversation with itself.
