The Hebrew term for the place of the crossing of the Red Sea is Yam Suph, (סוֹרְ-יַם). Suph also makes a pun with the Hebrew suph ah (storm) and soph ("end"), referring to the events of the Exodus.



Standing round the font reminds us of the Hebrews' climb ashore. Life is hallowed by the knowledge God has been this way before.
