

Pastor's Column

My bees died over the winter. I didn't see this coming. The hive had survived and produced honey for ten years. This record of longevity and production lulled their bee keeper (me) into a complacent disregard for the dangers bees face.

In canto 56 of his poem, "In Memoriam," Alfred, Lord Tennyson writes that nature is "red in tooth and claw." The violence of the natural world is ever-present in keeping bees. The bees face predators, parasites, and threats from the neighbor's insecticides. In the Fall of the year, the bees even kill off some of their own so that there won't be so many mouths to feed over the winter. Nature is red in tooth and claw.

Let me describe the devastation. When I opened the hive on a warm day recently, I found only a very few bees, all dead, with their heads stuck into the hexagonal cells of the honeycomb. This indicates starvation. It appeared that the queen bee had died some time earlier. There was a honey store available in their hive, but the bees didn't find it. Life is fragile.

Questions fly, whenever we face sadness and loss. We wonder about the balance of good and evil in the world. We wonder about why bad things happen. We wonder about how life, and love, and hope will proceed, and what end they may achieve.

Easter is coming, April 21. The resurrection of Christ is God's clearest message that life, and love, and hope are stronger than anything else. Before we reach Easter this year, our congregation will celebrate its 200th birthday. (The celebration dinner is April 14). There have been losses and triumphs in those 200 years; but the triumphs have sufficed to carry us forward. Our faith, and our keeping of the faith, is based on an Easter assurance. We carry that assurance forward into tomorrow, no matter what. No matter what happens today, we believe Easter is exemplary of God's promise, which cannot fail.

I have a new hive of bees on order! My new bees are coming by overnight delivery. They are a hybrid of several bee varieties, called Buckfast bees, because the hybrid was developed at the Buckfast Benedictine Abbey in Devonshire, England. You may be interested in a point of reference: The Buckfast Abbey will be 1001 years old this year.

God wins. Life wins. Love and hope stand the test of time. Nature is red in tooth and claw, but God is exceedingly good.

Happy Easter. Know you are loved.



GLORY TO GOD Celebrating 200 Years 1819-2019



Bowling Green Presbyterian Church

Shortly after the arrival of Reverend Samuel Wilson Calvert in 1831, local Presbyterians began to regroup and soon undertook to build a new house of worship to replace the original one in the town cemetery. Prominent entrepreneur, James Rumsey Skiles, started the fundraising by contributing a lot at the corner of present-day Tenth and State Streets and by enticing Hugh Roland, first resident architect of Nashville and Louisville, to rural Warren County. Roland's Gothic Revival design was ahead of its time for 1833 Kentucky and is perhaps the only one of his church buildings still standing. Construction continued until 1837, although the Bowling Green Female Academy was established in the basement somewhat earlier. Reverend Calvert died shortly, and the congregation split into Old School and New School factions, a division that lasted from 1839 until 1858, with separate ministers and alternate Sunday use of the building. Eventually people lost interest in which branch was meeting on a given Sunday and the factions reunited.

Presbyterian Women

Presbyterían Women Profíle—Peggy Carthrae

When asked what The Presbyterian Church means to her, Elsie Margaret (Peggy) Craig Carthrae says "this church is my spiritual home. "Peggy grew up in Bowling Green attending the TPC, as did her mother, Margaret Graham Craig, her grandparents Lawrence B. Graham and Margaret Beard Graham. Her roots go back to 1819 and Ann Graham, one of the founders of TPC.

Peggy's parents were married at home by Reverend Fred Turner. Her father, GG Craig, Jr. went off to war during WWII while Margaret stayed at home, living with her parents and giving birth to Peggy on March 8, 1945. Margaret did not know that her husband had been killed in battle on March 1 and would never know he had a daughter. She did not find out until March 23 about his death. Margaret and Peggy continued to live with Peggy's grandparents throughout her childhood, and her mother never re-married.

Peggy speaks fondly of TPC and her many childhood memories. Her mother taught kindergarten at the church, so Peggy attended kinder-

garten long before she was officially eligible. Growing up, Peggy's life revolved around the church and its many activities provided for young people. She remembers Summer Day Camp, especially Ches Johnson's farm and Noel Ennis' farm, and Bible School. Her Junior High Fellowship group met with other youths from the Synod and attended church camp at Land Between the Lakes—" before it was flooded." Peggy fondly remembers those days in TPC as her "growing up "time with the blessing of always having her church family near her at TPC. "My own family completely filled up a pew," she says, "and it was always the same one!"

Peggy has served TPC in many ways. She taught elementary grades Sunday School for several years. One year she served as an intern in charge of Bible School at both TPC and at the Delafield Church. She sang in the choir, and went on a mission trip to Reynosa, Mexico. Peggy made the wooden figures for the Godly Play Sunday School classes. She has been a deacon and an elder—more than once. She has been involved in Presbyterian Women, Habitat for Humanity, Saturday meals, and Room in the Inn.

Growing up in TPC was special to Peggy and was made even more so when she married Clark Carthrae in the church on July 12, 1969. Peggy and Clark had two children, Jeff and Carrie, both of whom were raised in TPC. Tragically, Jeff died of a heart problem at the age of 20. At that time, the church members were invaluable with their support and love that went out to Peggy's family. Carrie lives in Lexington, NC, and is mother to the Carthraes' grandson, Grayson, "a wonderful blessing."

Peggy received the Presbyterian Women's Honorary Life Membership in March of this year. Honorary Life Memberships are presented to women who have made significant contributions to the life of the church. They epitomize the best of Presbyterian Women -- persons with deep, abiding faith and a strong commitment to family, church, and community. She is the 48th woman from the Bowling Green church to receive the award since the first award was given in 1948.


