

Pastor's Column

The worst of the covid-19 pandemic is likely behind us. Now our congregation is ready to ask, "What's next?"

Most of the best self-studies for congregations ask the question, "If our church disappeared today, what would the community miss most?" Bowling Green would be down one steeple in the skyline. The Moore Insurance building and United Furniture would be out from under our shadow. The corner of 10th and State would look different. What else?

The Presbyterians, a people of generosity and quiet integrity, would be missed.

The gospel message of God's sovereignty demonstrated in forgiveness would have lost its staunchest voice.

Small Group Survey

In God's Church Nobody Should Feel Left Out!

This is a heading we all can agree with: nobody should feel left out in God's church. Yes, we know that we all are one congregation, but we cannot be in contact with all other members. We have a group of people that we are in contact with—friends and family, but what if you come to our church and you don't have friends or family in the congregation? What if you don't make new friends easily? Are we sure nobody feels left out here at The Presbyterian Church?

God's church is a place where all should belong, all feel included. God makes us one body-we are not just a group of individuals. We all need each other. The concept of small groups helps us to organize the congregation in such a way that nobody feels left out. When each of us is a member of a small group we have a place to belong, to be noticed if absent, to be helped. Small groups are where we grow to know more about each other. We are all needed in a small group and being needed is an important pre-requisite to feeling accepted.

In God's church we are all responsible for one another because we all belong to one body. We have the responsibility to pray for each other, to help materially, to help when there is sickness, to encourage one another, to celebrate life's joys together, and to share one another's burdens. That is hard to do when we are only a part of the big congregation. Small groups help us be responsible for one another. We are able to know and love and care for the 8-10 people in our small group. And that is multiplied because everyone in each group is looking after each other!

The vision of the Small Groups Ministry is for everyone in our church to experience the transforming power of small groups in the next 3-5 years. The purposes of small groups are to connect and care for each other, to study and apply God's word to our lives, to serve those in need in our community, and to grow the church, spiritually and numerically.

We are planning to launch several new small groups in the next few months and hope you want to be involved. Included in this newsletter is a Survey to help the Small Group Task Force in planning. We anticipate having in-person options beginning at Rally Day, in addition to the groups already meeting. 


