

Pastor's Column

What's happening this month?

Advent began on November 27th. Advent is a season in the Christian calendar, during which we prepare for Christ to come: 1. As a baby born in Bethlehem long ago, and 2. As the King of Glory entering our hearts through faith in the here-and-now, and 3. As the Son of God who will come to stand in judgment and in mercy at the end of time.

I hope you are already enjoying the excellent <u>Advent Devotional</u> with entries for each day, written by our own church members.

Each of three <u>Wednesday nights in Advent</u> (November 30, December 7, and 14) we will enjoy a light meal in the Fellowship Hall at 6:05 PM, to be followed by a short study on the words Hope, Peace, Love, and Joy. Donations will be accepted for the meal, and the amount collected will be directed to the support of Room in the Inn, Living Waters for the World, and the Churches United in Christ Help Ministry.

Wednesday Night, December 7th, we will go together on a bus to **shop for the Angel Tree families**, leaving from the Church after the study, at approximately 6:45 PM.

Sunday, December 11th will be the annual <u>Lessons and Carols</u> service at 10:30 AM. The biblical history of salvation is remembered, beginning with the Fall of Adam and Even in the garden, and finishing with the extraordinary prologue to John's gospel "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God..."

Sunday, December 18th, we will go <u>caroling</u>, bringing the music of the season to homebound people, and to our area retirement communities. We will head out after worship.

<u>Christmas Eve, December 24</u>, we will have <u>one service of worship, at 5:00 PM</u>. This will be designed for all ages, and will include communion and the lighting of candles at the end of the service.

<u>Christmas Day is a Sunday</u> this year, so we will celebrate the birth of our savior at 10:30 AM.

As long as we remember Christ and the joy of the salvation he brings, our lives will remain full of Christmas gladness throughout the year.




Missions



Our Angel tree Delivery day will be on Saturday, December 17th. If you would like to be involved in helping deliver the gifts please speak to <u>David Clarke</u>.




Youth group will continue to meet and run in the new year while David Clarke is at home in Northern Ireland. If you have any questions or want more information contact Mary Evans.

LESSONS AND CAROLS—DECEMBER 11, 2022 AT 10:30 AM

A service of Lessons and Carols was first done in the late 19th century but later made popular by King's College, Cambridge, who held their first service in 1918. Readings and music are paired as we recall God's historic willingness to bless, and the fulfillment of blessing in the coming of Jesus Christ the Lord.

Along with congregational singing and Advent Wreath Lighting, the music in this year's Lessons and Carols will feature the Chancel Choir, Children's Choir, Colligate Singers and Tom Moody on organ. A special guest string quartet will accompany in a variety of beautiful and uplifting Christmas anthems, traditional carols, Christmas solos and instrumentals.
