HELP!!! CHURCHES UNITED IN CHRIST 'HELP" MINISTRY is in need of your help! This ministry is comprised of four downtown churches; Christ Episcopal, First Christian, State Street Methodist and The Presbyterian Church. It was started in 2002 to help people in need in an organized program. It has evolved over the years and essentially helps now with utility bills. The recipients are able to receive assistance one time in a calendar year and are tracked through the computer program Charity Tracker. The money is taken to the billing entity (not to the person in need, who receives a voucher). Each church gives what they are able to the ministry; once a month we receive \$720 from our church budget. As you can imagine, with inflation and energy prices rising we see individual bills that are that high. The numbers that we see needing help has also increased dramatically. We-Bud Schlinker, Faye Patton, Kyda West, and Sandy Franklin-try to be good stewards, but the need is so great and the people so desperate that we often have to dip into our \$3000 buffer that is now depleted.
