Almost Goodbye

This will be my next-to-last Angelos article, covering January, my last month as pastor of Christ Lutheran. I'll save my teary farewells for the next Angelos!

I love the fact that my last month here is during the Season of Epiphany. The entire church year is built around the Jesus story but in a particular way Epiphany is the season that brings who Jesus is to the forefront. From



his baptism in the Jordan (week 1 of Epiphany) to the Mount of Transfiguration account (the final week of Epiphany) the whole season intends for us to see Jesus and get a sense of his true identity. If Christmas makes clear that Jesus is fully human, then Epiphany wants to make it clear that Jesus isn't only human.

One of the words that gets highlighted this season is the word 'glory'. It's the outshining of who God is (something akin to the light that emanates from the sun). It is so brilliant that when people came in contact with it in the Old Testament they had to shield themselves from it. But in Jesus God has done something remarkable (in Fleming Rutledge's words), *"He is willing to shrink himself, so to speak, so that we are not swallowed up alive by his glory."* No one would ever have guessed that one of God's qualities was the ability to shrink himself!

There are some standard stories that come with this season. The Day of Epiphany (12 days after Christmas) features the magi (or wise men) coming with their gifts, and King Herod being not all too happy about that. The next Sunday always has Jesus in the river getting baptized (I love Dale Bruner's comment on this, he thinks of this as the first miracle of Jesus' ministry,

“the miracle of his humility.”). Jesus getting baptized begs the question, “If baptism has to do with repentance, why is Jesus in the river?” And then Epiphany always ends with Jesus on the Mount of Transfiguration, being changed for just a moment.

There are other stories that we read depending on which particular year it is (Year A, B, or C – we are now in Year A). I want to focus on one that seems especially good for us (Christ Lutheran and the Kalms’s) to hear. It’s the John 2:1-11 account of Jesus at the wedding of Cana.

The story is familiar – a wedding that has run out of wine. This is hardly a catastrophe in terms of the suffering that’s going on at any given moment somewhere in the world. But it would have been embarrassing for the host family on one of the biggest days of their lives.

When Mary tells the servants, “Do whatever he tells you,” she is fully confident that Jesus can do something (Leslie Newbigin writes, “*This is not apathetic resignation; it is expectant faith.*”).

When the water that has become wine is brought out the steward (sort of an ancient version of a caterer) says: “Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now.”

At this point at the wedding everyone thought the highpoint of the wedding had happened, now you had to settle for whatever was left. But something new happens when Jesus is involved: “You have saved the best till now!”



Can we believe this wedding at Cana holds a promise both for Christ Lutheran and Thelma and Ralf Kalms? What’s the promise? Not lots of good wine in our future (maybe that too!). But this – God has a great surprise for all of us as we move into the next chapter of our church and Ralf/Thelma’s lives. The best is not behind us but instead before us. “You have saved the best till now,” maybe we should make that the Christ Lutheran slogan or catch phrase for this next year. Rather than approach what’s coming with a sense of resignation let’s believe that

the Lord who surprised everyone at a wedding in Cana has some surprises in store for us. Maybe even the best is still coming!

Many years ago I came across this prayer on a Beyond Malibu trip:

O Lord God, who hast called thy servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown: Give us faith to go out with a good courage, not knowing whither we go, but only that thy hand is leading us, and thy love supporting us through Jesus Christ our Lord.

I love the sense of adventure this prayer has. Let’s be a church and a husband and wife of good courage because we are being led by such a good Guide.
