

Is 'Revival' Lutheran?

"Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?" Psalm 85:6

Lately I've begun listening to various podcasts while in the gym. One of the one's I've enjoyed is connected to Alpha, the home and small-group centered approach to



reaching others with the Christian message (we've done a number of rounds of Alpha here at Christ Lutheran).

I recently watched Nikki Gumbel, for many years the leader of the Alpha movement and an Anglican cleric, doing a talk at an Alpha leadership conference. His talk was called 'The Healing of the Nations.' One of the things he said that we see in the history of the church is that crisis (in culture and the church) always precedes renewal.

If that's true we must be on the cusp of something significant! I don't remember a time in which our nation has been more fractured and divided than it is now (and I lived through the 1960's and through the early 70's!). But there are indications that interest in Christian faith and

church-going are on the rise, especially among younger people. 'The Spectator', a weekly British political and cultural news magazine had an article, "A Christian revival is under way in Britain." British churches, long largely empty, are filling up.

We have just begun a yearlong study on the Book of Acts, in part because I'm interested to see what happened 2000 years ago to account for the dynamic spread of the Christian message. There were no leadership seminars or evangelism conferences, and no experts on church growth. Mostly what you had were ordinary people who had come to believe the gospel story of Jesus. Empowered and filled with the Holy Spirit (also called the Spirit of Jesus Christ in Philippians 1:19), these ordinary Christians became members of a movement that was to impact their world.

Revival is a word usually associated with Pentecostals, and sometimes Baptists. But what was the Luther movement in the early 1500's other than a revival – people experiencing the love of Jesus Christ in personal ways? Luther described his own experience in revival-like language: "I felt that I had been born anew and that the gates of heaven had been opened. The whole of Scripture gained a new meaning. And from that point on the phrase, 'the justice of God' no longer filled me with hatred, but rather became unspeakably sweet by virtue of a great love."

Luther's own heart had been renewed and the coldness of so many Christian lives was warmed by the presence of God's Spirit. The month in which we remember the Reformation (Reformation Day is October 26) would be a great month for a renewal to begin among us.

I long for the warming and renewal of God's Spirit again, especially in my own life!
I would love nothing more than to retire from Christ Lutheran in the midst of revival! A church growing ever deeper in its love of Christ and ever more passionate in sharing the love of Christ with others.

There is an old hymn that includes this verse and chorus: Revive us again - fill each heart with thy love; May each soul be rekindled with fire from above Hallelujah, thine the glory! Hallelujah, Amen! Hallelujah, thine the glory! Revive us again.

Amen!
