


One Holy Catholic Church

"Despite the differences in natural languages, the Church is united by the common language of the Holy Spirit, who speaks the great acts of God." Karl Barth, Lectures on the Scots Confession

Every week when we use the Apostles Creed I am always taken and reminded what we believe about the church. "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins . . ." Can we ever understand the miracle that is the church?



"To dwell above with saints I love, oh, that will be glory. To dwell below with saints I know, now that's a different story!"

Indeed!

But the church is a miracle – think of it: a small handful of largely uneducated people gathering around Jesus in an obscure corner of the Roman Empire. Before ascending Jesus tells them they are to go into all the world and tell his story. What could this have possibly meant to a group of people who hadn't ever traveled more than 100 miles from their homes? But by the time those people died they had brought their faith in Jesus to Rome and Athens, to North Africa and India. There's a good chance the gospel was being spread in France and Spain.

All of this because of largely untrained followers of Jesus.
But untrained was overcome by Spirit-filled, Spirit-led, Spiritempowered. Ordinary men and women were inhabited by the very Spirit
of Jesus Christ and in this turned that movement miraculous!

One of best news pieces about the church is that there is 'one holy catholic Church.' We don't confess faith about the Lutheran Church or any other denomination for that matter. What we believe is there is but one church (which is what the word 'catholic' mean in the creeds). Whatever

the denominational label, it is secondary. What matters is belonging to Jesus Christ and to the one community of faith he has founded. That's the church that is a miracle.

This summer I've seen a number of examples of how good it is that we are one church. In July, Dan Tchobanoff, a former and long-time member of Christ Lutheran, passed away. Dan

and Doris have for the past 15 years or so been members of Lake City Community Church (a church very different from our own). But at the service for Dan I saw 30-40 Christ Lutheran people in attendance, and most of the treats at the reception came from Christ Lutheran people. That is a witness – there is but one church!

This past week I had lunch with Pastor Andre Winston, of Blessed Temple (an African-American Pentecostal congregation). In terms of worship style and church governance I'm not sure you could be further apart than Blessed Temple and Christ Lutheran. But Pastor Andre and I talked about our 10-year history, the Compassion Weekend projects at his church, the finances Christ Lutheran has invested at Blessed Temple. We talked about the hours Scott Robinson spent at Blessed temple doing electrical work.

Our relationship with Blessed Temple is a witness – there is but one church!

As I'm entering my final season as pastor of Christ Lutheran I've been reflecting on this blessed place God led Thelma and myself to. I am so very thankful for Christ Lutheran and to all it has meant to us. But even more-so I am thankful for the "holy catholic church." That church unites us to all believers and followers of Jesus Christ. We are connected to Christians of every culture, ethnic group, language, and color. We are also connected to Christians with differing theological convictions. But the oneness of the holy catholic church comes from its center – Jesus Christ. Keep the attention there and you have the holy catholic church.



One church, the miracle of which I get to experience in one particular congregation – Christ Lutheran. Thank God for both!




Rooted
