2022 has been an eventful year in the life and ministries of First Baptist Church. As we have continued to settle into what life and ministry looks like following the onset of the COVID-19 Pandemic, we have been able to celebrate the movement and blessing of God in many ways. We were able, for the first time in several years, to gather together for church meals and larger fellowship activities. We celebrated the ribbon cutting and dedication of our Family Life Center. We more than doubled the number of baptisms celebrated in the year prior and we welcomed many new members to our church family. We also have a full staff for the first time in my service as Senior Pastor.

We also welcomed Camp Navigate into our building for their Summer Programming for the first time. Every day, 265 children roamed our hallways, played and learned in our classrooms, and ate meals in our fellowship hall. The exposure we are receiving in our community through this partnership is already beginning to yield results. Attendance at our Community Day was nearly 50% children and families that we had not had prior contact with. Community leaders have reached out to me, thanking First Baptist for the commitment, love, and care that we are showing our community. I am excited to see what partnerships like this one turn into in our future.

It is important to note that all of these blessings have occurred in the face of many challenges. Like many churches, our post-pandemic worship attendance has dropped to 1/3 of what it was prior to COVID-19 arriving. Our Connection Groups, especially for those in their 30's and 40's, have struggled to continue to meet. We have lost volunteers and have struggled to replace them. In the last two years alone, we lost 51 of our active church members to death, chronic illness, or relocation. As a result, our giving has seen a decrease and we project finishing the year at a significant financial deficit for the first time in many years.

This is a time of blessing and challenge, but we are a church equipped to move forward through the challenges. I believe this because we are a church that seeks to be faithful to our God, whatever that may look like. Thank you for being a part of our church family.



Our workout group has enjoyed the indoor space to exercise together and our large church meals have been easier to pull together. We were also able to host our first large event, as the ABC-IN/KY Region hosted their biennial in our facility. We are also very excited to host our first season of Upward Indoor Soccer in the gym in January.

We currently have several community ministries and organizations inquiring about using the space. We are in the process of scheduling open gym nights to invite the community in and create opportunity for new relationships. We are in conversations with an addictions ministry in Terre Haute to provide services to men and women in recovery through the building. The facility expansion is already creating new ministry opportunities and new relationships with our community. Thank you to each of you who helped make it possible.

# ASSOCIATE PASTOR OF DISCIPLESHIP

This past June, I celebrated my first full year with THFBC. I'm so grateful for how willingly my family has been embraced and included into the church!

This past week, I've been reflecting on God leading his people through the wilderness. There are times when God would lead people somewhere new and times when he would call them to remain (check out Exodus 40:36-38). It reminded me of a conversation I had earlier this fall about all the new things happening at THFBC, both things that were added and things that had changed from previous years. - Seeing the excitement on our kids' faces as Bo unveiled the new Children's Church. We transitioned to a new Children's Pastor, new curriculum, and new room design.

- Seeing our neighbors photographing their kids as they jump down a waterslide. We added more elements to Community Day and reached further into our surrounding community.

Spending the last six months in the role of Children's Director has been such a blessing, I cannot thank you enough for this opportunity.

VBS was filled with interactive bible stories, creative games, singing new songs and some old favorites, hilarious skits, tons of God moments and true fellowship between our kids while 60 of us came together daily for a week. With all the new and hip songs our children loved "Great is Thy Faithfulness" most of all and requested to sing it over and over; how powerful. My favorite part of everyday was the closing when we asked the kids who wanted to pray. So many hands shot up and their prayers showed the true love for others these kids hold in their hearts. Awesome God!

During our Sunday Morning first hour we have been focusing on creating a worship service very similar to the adult worship service. Our space has been overhauled and the children are loving it. From going to having no children wanting to lead worship songs to having 13 eagerly wanting to lead, we are creating confident leaders who will one day no doubt be up front leading worship in our main sanctuary. August began our one year study of the Bible from beginning to end, showing the kids how the Bible is one big story of God's unstoppable love for humanity.

Our Sunday Morning small groups are being lead by three wonderful volunteers and are growing exponentially. While numbers aren't everything, we were seeing around half of our large group leave before small groups started every week, now we see 90% stay each week for small group. The kids are wanting to stay, they are wanting to dive deeper into the Bible and connect more with their peers. Our curriculum focuses on taking our sermon Bible story and applying it to our kid's everyday lives. Our children our learning how to read the Bible and then turn around and put it to use today. It is a powerful tool to be able to read a passage of the Bible that seems to have nothing in common with our current world but then find the message God is telling us, our children are practicing this skill weekly.

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# BO KLEMAN CHILDREN'S MINISTER

Wednesday Night classes ran through the Spring with a deep dive into the life of Jesus. We took the Summer off and have started back up with a new curriculum, Mission Kids. A host of volunteers have our kids focusing on foreign and local missionaries, the areas they serve and their service projects. While studying Puerto Rico, they were hit with a devastating hurricane and our children were able to raise \$195.27 and send directly to the area they were studying. While studying Central Asia Refugees, we were able to collect 100+ toys and books to give to refugee children who are located here in Terre Haute. Weekly 20-30 kids excitedly show up to learn about missions around the world, and how they can impact the work being done.

Our Halloween celebration, Night Light, was spread across Terre Haute at 8 different locations, serving 2,400 kids. While getting to serve so many kids was awesome, the thing we heard over and over from the people who participated in the event was they loved spending time with others in our church outside our normal church services.

Our children are growing. They are growing in knowledge of the Word, their relationship with God and their connection with their church family. I pray over these children; for them to be flourishing Christians, for their fellowship to be strong, for their love of others to drown out the noise of the world and for their hearts to constantly be drawn to Him. The amazing part is that I get to see this prayer answered over and over every week, come and hang out with us some, the kids at THFBC are pretty amazing.

#### TRUSTEE MINISTRY TEAM

The new year brought some new faces to the Trustee Team. Current members include Mike Allen, Sharon Cordray, Brian Hopton, Sue Kiger, Tom Manson, Caitlin Miller, Steve Reed and Connie Sheehan. Officer positions were filled as follows, Chairman - Sharon Cordray, Vice Chairman - Sue Kiger and Secretary - Steve Reed.

Highlights of accomplishments this year include the followng:

The copier system was replaced. Having researched options, the most cost effective plan was to purchase two refurbished copiers from CDS Office Technologies; one copier for the main office and one for the Preschool office. The new copiers, Konica Minolta BizHub C369 \$1390 - 2 drawer staple/hole punch, also provide the most economical service agreement.

Chris Cordray has signed the Boy Scout Troop Charter, becoming the Charter Organization Representative.

The Trustee Ministry Team was challenged to come up with goals as a ministry team. These are intended to benefit the health and life of First Baptist Church in the coming year. The three areas we will continue to pursue are:

- Giving as a church. Increase the aspect of giving on the part of people giving more than just money but skills, time and efforts.
- Pledge Cards there was a concern expressed that this practice has stopped and perhaps it needs to be renewed
- Educate New members and young members need to be educated in the ways the church is managed.

In February the team discussed the possibility of creating a multi-year capital budget. This process will help maintain continuity from year-to-year as Team members change over time. Continuation of this process will be underway in the upcoming year.

The computer system in the balcony was replaced. A Mac Minicomputer was purchased to be used for the worship service needs. Four tablets have been purchased to create an electronic check-in system in the atrium. Volunteers remain on hand to assist members with the system. This system assists us in more efficiently taking attendance. This system also works with our current children's department check-in system.

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## MINISTRY TEAM REPORTS



#### TRUSTEE MINISTRY TEAM

A search committee was formed to hire a Children's Pastor following Jill Kirchoff's retirement. The committee was made up of Diana Allen, Chrissy Barbour-Morley, Karen Lyon, Becca Campbell, Sharon Cordray and Steven White. John Campbell and Tim Noxon represented the church staff, After a series of interviews, Bo Kleman was offered the position.

Refurbishment projects were undertaken. A team of several volunteers did a great job of painting the interiors walls, doors and door trim. New carpet tiles have been installed in the hallways, atrium and sanctuary. We are so grateful to all the volunteers for these projects. Refurbishment projects we are looking at for the future include the following:

- Replacing the main sign at the front of the lawn.
- Painting the mount for the main cross on the north side of the building
- Repair cracks and tuck-pointing on various areas of the building.
- Painting and or replacing the soffit or fascia around the building.
- Upgrading the landscaping on the north side of the building.
- Resurfacing and re-lining the parking lot

Don Edwards from Wabash Capital met with the Trustees giving us an overview of the market as well as a detailed report of the church's investment portfolio and its performance, There was open discussion about the market, the future, and the church's investment policy and a consensus that the church's investment policy is good, and we need to stay the course with our investment policy.

A Task Force was created to develop a Facility Use Policy. The Task Force was made up of Sue Kiger, JoAnne, Woodcock, Connie Sheehan, Caitlin Miller, and Sharon Cordray. John Campbell, Tim Noxon and Darlene Thomas contributed to the policy from the church staff point of view. After several months we have created a Use Policy Handbook and Updated the Wedding Handbook that will work hand in hand. It is our hope that we can make our facility available to members of the congregation and the community for a wide variety of activities.

A new lease for the Camp Navigate programs has been created and is agreeable to both the church and the Camp Navigate program. It is such a blessing to be able to provide such a great opportunity for outreach to the children in this program.

# 2021 MINISTRY TEAM REPORTS



## CHRISTIAN EDUCATION MINISTRY TEAM

First I would like to recognize the Christian Education team members for their time and effort in making 2022 a productive year. Beverly Newman, Cherokee Marts, Jessie Money, Jess Riddell (Secretary), Jim Clarke, Marty Cardwell (Vice-Chair), Misty Keathley, and Ronnie Enstrom. Additionally, I would like to thank Tim Noxon, Neil Morley and Bo Kleman for providing guidance to the team.

We began the year by establishing four goals:

- 1. Determine what size our Connection Groups should be,
- 2. Make changes to current Connection Group structure (teacher driven or discussion driven) as needed,
- 3. Acclimate new Children's Pastor to the position, and
- 4. Promote church connection activities to bring multi-generations together.

Similar to 2021, we entered the new year with a staff position vacancy created when Jill Kirchoff, Children's Pastor, retired. A search committee was formed in early February and the position was filled by Bo Kleman in May. Prior to filling this position, the decision was made to host VBS and Bo volunteered to Co-Direct along with Tim. A church-wide survey was conducted to obtain opinions on various aspects of VBS such as dates and times for the event, but it resulted in limited responses. VBS was held July 11-15 9-noon Monday - Friday.
