

Our Sunday morning Connection Groups meet every week at 10:45AM, following our morning worship service. Groups exist for all ages, including children and youth. We value our groups as vital connection points to other Christians as we endeavor to learn, grow, and serve together..

COLLEGE/YOUNG ADULT GROUPS: Our College/Young Adult groups are open to college students, graduate students, and young adults.

NEW HOPE (Room 170): Our New Hope Group includes individuals in their 20's - 40's and typically follows a discussion format for learning.

NEW COVENANT (Room 163): Our New Covenant Group includes individuals in their 50's - 60's and typically follows a group discussion format for learning.

GENESIS (Room 126): Our Genesis Group includes individuals in their 50's - 70's and typically utilizes a lecture format for learning.

DOUBLE RING (Room 124): Our Double Ring Group includes individuals in their 70s - 80's and typically follows a blend of lecture based and group discussion style learning.

SANCTUARY QUESTION & RESPONSE (Sanctuary): Each Sunday, we host an open group in the sanctuary with the goal of providing space for questions, conversation, and deeper learning following the morning message.

SEASONAL TOPICAL STUDIES: Throughout the year, we also offer a variety of seasonal, topical studies. These groups typically last 6-8 weeks and focus on a specific topic, such as Financial Peace University.



WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE STUDY (ROOM 126): Our Wednesday Night Bible Study meets each week from 6:30-7:30PM. The group is open to anyone and is a blend of lecture/group discussion style learning with the goal of deepening our understanding of how to read the Bible and to live out our faith as disciples of Jesus Christ.

LIFT WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY: LIFT meets each Saturday morning at 9:30AM at Maggie & Moe's Coffeeshop. This women's group is open to anyone who would like to attend and utilizes a group discussion style of learning.

SEASONAL WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY (Room 126): Our Seasonal Women's Bible Study typically meets once in the spring and once in the fall for approximately 8 weeks at a time. The study employs video/lecture style learning with some discussion.
