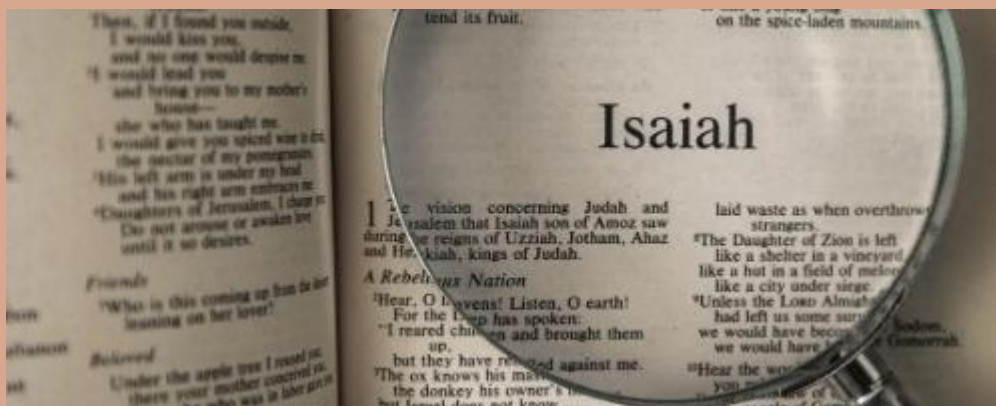

### STUDY OF ISAIAH - WEEK 3

#### FOCUS ATTENTION

Consider traditional wedding vows. What promises do couples make or imply by saying, "I do"?

#### EXPLORE THE BIBLE - ISAIAH 7:7-9

Contextualize verses 7-9 by reading verses 1-6. Why do you suppose God sent a message to King Ahaz?

How did God challenge King Ahaz in verse 9? How does this verse challenge us today?

#### ISAIAH 7:10-13

How does God's offer confirm His promises are true?

#### ISAIAH 7:14-15

Why was it important for God to give a sign despite Ahaz's unbelief?

How does this prophecy affirm God fulfills His promises?

ISAIAH 7:16-17

Remind participants of our study on God's judgment in Session 1. What does God's judgment teach us?

SUMMARIZE & CHALLENGE

In what ways can we actively demonstrate our faith in God's promises?

Personal Challenge: Evaluate your own faithfulness in keeping promises. Pray, thanking God for the promises kept, and ask Him to reveal any promises you've not kept. Ask for God's forgiveness!
