This fall, we're excited to expand our retreat by including congregations from across the Northwestern Minnesota Synod to join the Eastern North Dakota Synod for our annual Fall Youth Retreat. Our hope is simple: to welcome as many young people as possible for a weekend of worship, community, fun, and faith formation.

We can't wait! Together we will IMAGINE MORE, and we'll begin leaning into this bigger story of faith, possibility, and God's call in our lives as we ask: *What might God be inviting us to imagine beyond what we can see right now?* This retreat is designed for youth and leaders to:

- Build community

- Deepen faith through worship, learning, and conversation

- Experience fun, rest, and connection

- Explore how God calls us to imagine more for our lives, our churches, and our world

Whether your group has attended for years or this is your first time, this retreat is a meaningful and accessible way to invest in your young people. We know fall calendars fill quickly, so now is the time to begin planning.

THEME

This year's theme is **Imagine More** — inspired by the 2027 ELCA Youth Gathering theme. At the heart of this theme is the invitation to trust that God is always at work beyond what we can see, understand, or expect.

Imagine More calls us to expand our vision: to imagine a faith that expands beyond Sunday, a love that reaches beyond our comfort zones, a justice that transforms communities, and a God whose possibilities are greater than our limitations.

Throughout the weekend, we'll invite young people to wonder:

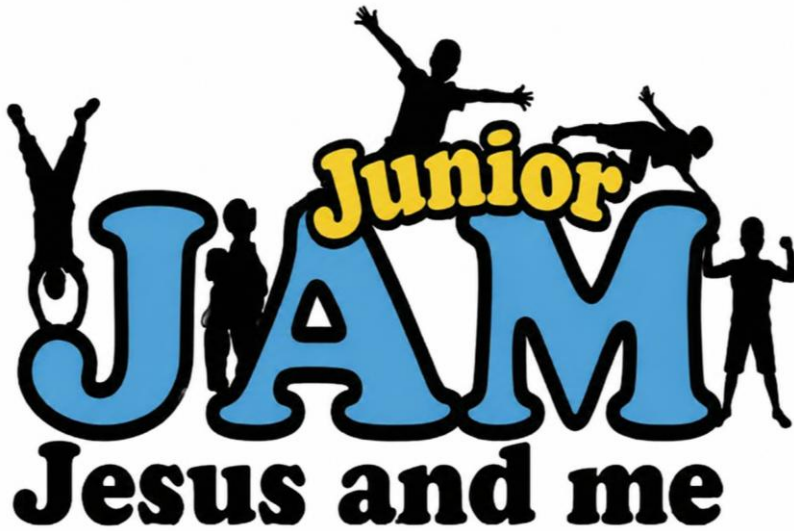
- What does it mean to imagine more for my own faith journey?

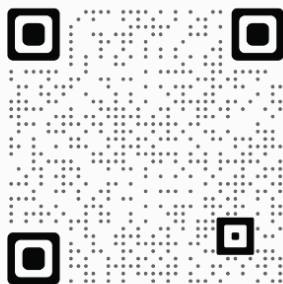

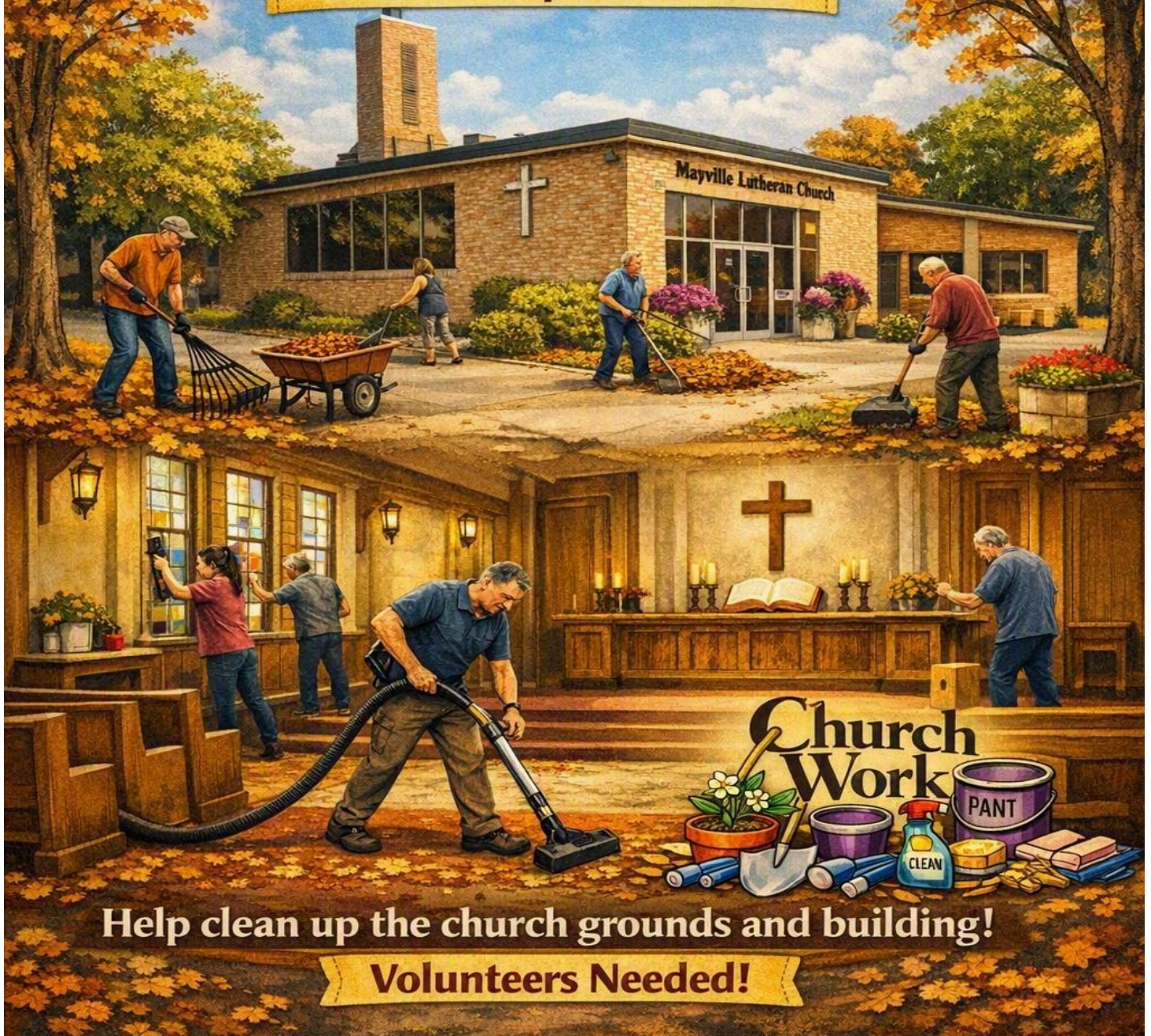

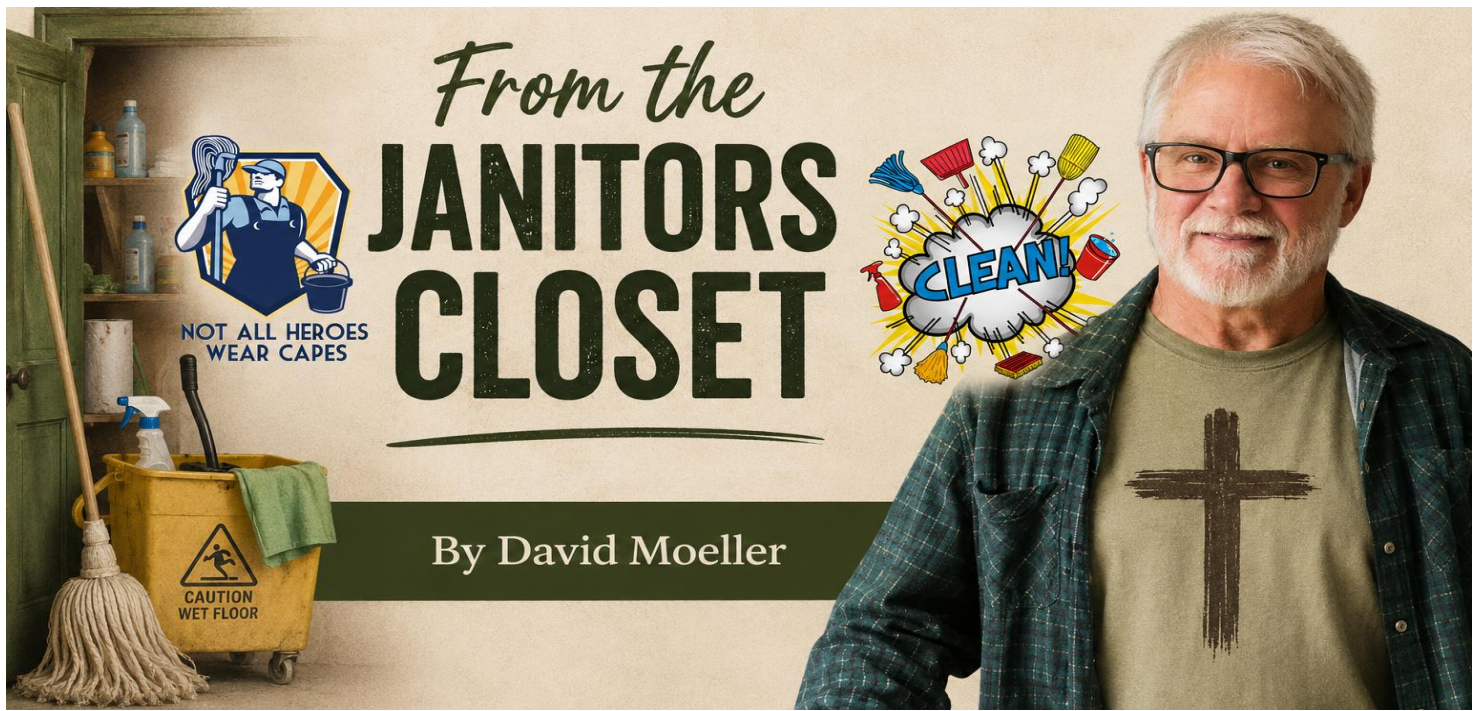

"There You Will Find Refuge"

Not long ago, I got a glimpse of the living hope we have in knowing Christ as our Savior after reading about the aftermath of a forest fire in Yellowstone National Park. One park ranger who was assessing the damage found a bird literally petrified in ashes, perched statuesquely on the ground at the base of a tree. Somewhat sickened by the eerie sight, the ranger knocked over the bird with a stick.

When he gently tapped it, three tiny chicks scurried out from under their dead mother's ashen wings. The loving mother, keenly aware of impending disaster, had carried her offspring to the base of the tree and gathered them under her wings, sensing the approaching danger. She could have flown to safety but refused to abandon her babies. Then the blaze arrived, and the heat scorched her small body. Through this, the mother remained steadfast; she had been willing to die so those under the cover of her wings would live.

When I read about this little bird that saved her babies, I thought of Psalm 91:4a. Here the Bible reminds us: **"He will cover you with His pinions, and under His wings you will find refuge."** The wings of God were the gift of His Son, the power of His cross, and the glory of His resurrection.

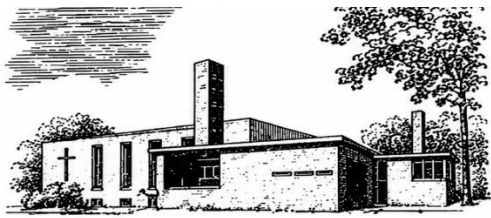
All of us are caught up in the conflagration of sin, death, and the power of the devil. Our death is assured if we are left to our own power to try to escape these destructive forces. It is for this reason that God so loved each of us that He sent His own Son to gather us under His protective wings.

On Calvary the blazing fire of evil and all our sins struck our Savior. He died with us gathered under His wings so that we, too, might live. The apostle Paul says it this way: **"For our sake He made Him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21).** The dead body of Christ was not a pillar of ash that was knocked over and forgotten, as it was with the mother bird's body. Rather, on the third day, He arose from the dead giving us a true and living hope now and throughout eternity.

The apostle John is reminding us that there is no greater definition of love than one who is willing to lay down his or her life for someone else. How thankful we can be for those who have sacrificed their lives—in any way—so that someone else might live. These acts of love continue to remind us that the greatest act of love is found in Jesus who willingly gave His life for ours.

Thanks be to God who gives us victory in our Lord Jesus Christ. WE PRAY: Dear Lord Jesus, overwhelm us with Your love so that we can love others the way You love us. Amen.

Call to Order- Tami time: 5:35

Opening Prayer – Pr. Paul

Approval of minutes: Richelle 1st, Tressta 2nd: approved.

Additions to the agenda: Richelle amplify, Myrna Lyng,

Treasurer’s report -Jessica gone. Richelle reports offering has been coming in positively.

Pastor’s Report:

- Working on alternative worships (music) just in case we don’t have pianists. Do have a schedule for pianists through June.
- Pastor does plan to take vacation in June.
- Did bring anti choking tool to place next to the AED.
- Pastor’s Expense Report – Council reviewed pastors expense reimbursement request, including mileage. Discussed and approved mileage and expenses in part totaling \$761.19. Rae 1st, Richelle 2nd, approved.

New Business

1. Sunday School Superintendent position: Melissa Kornkven agreed to take over. She will be a great addition. We are happy she is interested and willing to move into this position. Tami will be of assistance if she needs.
2. Tiny town report:
 - a. Requested consideration for playground in parking lot. Has since reconsidered due to licensing time constraints. Not going to move the playground at this time, but may be interested in moving forward with it at another time.
 - b. SS partition placement for summer until Aug 15th. Square footage has a partition, Tiny Town asked if they could move it for summer space. Should not be an issue.
 - c. Contract coming up soon. Start discussions now. Agreement seems to be going well as this time. We are pleased with how things are going and hope that Mandi feels the same. Wondering if she would be interested in multi-year contract.
3. Next fellowship event?
 - a. Richelle’s house was a success. What more can we do as a congregation to continue bringing people together? Discussion around including sports teams from the college. Would like to discuss further at our next meeting.

- b. Lots of positive feedback from the football team with the cards and pictures.
- c. Spaghetti meal for a larger group could be another way to include others.
 - i. Goal will be to plan for something in the fall.
- 4. Senior quilts: need to be part of congregation to receive one or no?
 - a. Discussion regarding who gets quilts. We feel that the quilting group is able to make the decision on how many quilts they make and distribute each year.
 - b. A few seniors that were recognized this year and are members were not present for senior recognition. The quilts were placed in the church and we hope that they will be picked up by those that they are made for.
- 5. Amplify
 - a. Our website is being bought out by Amplify. Many things we can do with the new site, however, there is a cost. Rather than three distributors it would be under one. Monthly cost would be \$150 currently pay \$177. It would be a cost of \$2700 for set up. Website configuration and transfer \$1500. Could do 12 mo. payments. Would allow for streaming to YouTube and Facebook as well. Richelle is going to talk to Jess B to discuss financial piece. Richelle would like to act on this sooner rather than later so that she can begin to implement it over the summer. Motion to approve pending budget approval: Mary 1st, Tressta 2nd. Approved pending budget approval.

 - a. Quilting room. She expressed frustration with the quilting room and things being piled up in there. We are willing to move the tables to clear up some of the space in that room.
 - b. Organization and moving things can be a summer project. We will look at moving things to clear up space.

Mayville State and UNDSHMS alumnus to deliver prestigious aviation medicine lecture at ASMA USHM Conference

DENVER, Colo. — Emergency & EMS physician Dr. John Lyng, graduate of Mayville State University (BS 2001) and the UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences (MD 2005) will deliver the 71st Louis H. Bauer Lecture on May 18th at the Aerospace Medical Association (ASMA) and Undersea and Hyperbaric Medical Society (UHMS) Annual Scientific Meeting in Denver, Colorado.

The Louis H. Bauer Lecture* is one of the conference's featured presentations, recognizing contributions and leadership in aerospace and operational medicine. Dr. Lyng's lecture, "Redefining Readiness in the Sky: Development of Evidence-Based Recommendations to Update On-Board Medical Kits in the United States," is expected to focus on advancing emergency medical preparedness and volunteer medical responder capabilities during in-flight medical events occurring on board US-based commercial passenger aircraft. This lecture will pull back the curtain and provide insight into how a panel of medical and aviation experts used epidemiologic data and expert consensus to develop evidence-supported recommendations to update federal requirements governing the contents of on-board medical kits found on US-based commercial passenger aircraft.

The annual ASMA USHM conference brings together physicians, researchers, aviation professionals, military experts, and human performance specialists from around the world to discuss emerging issues in aerospace medicine, safety, and human systems integration.

Colleagues describe Dr. Lyng as a strong advocate for improving care of patients in the out-of-hospital environment. His work has contributed to ongoing discussions surrounding medical kit standards, physician responder training, and emergency preparedness both on the ground and in the air.

The conference will be held in Denver, Colorado, and is expected to attract international attendees from government agencies, academia, industry, and clinical medicine.

**A number of prominent figures in aerospace medicine, aviation, government, and space exploration have delivered the prestigious Louis H. Bauer Lecture over the years. Notable past speakers include:*

- Frank Borman — delivered the 27th annual Bauer Lecture in 1982.
- James A. Lovell — presented the 1979 lecture, reflecting on human spaceflight and exploration.
- James E. Webb — gave the 1962 Bauer Lecture on the exploration and utilization of space during the early Apollo era.
- Eugene M. Stahr — delivered the 1966 lecture titled Universe and Universities.
- Robert P. Hallion — presented the 1999 lecture focused on the future of aerospace medicine entering the new millennium.
- Johann-Dietrich Wörner — delivered the 65th Annual Louis H. Bauer Lecture in 2019.
- Jeffrey R. Davis — delivered the 70th Louis H. Bauer Lecture in 2025 on innovation and human performance at NASA.
- Thomas V. Draude — delivered the 41st Annual Louis H. Bauer Lecture in 1995 discussing women in combat aviation and military operations.

The lecture series is considered one of the highest-profile keynote traditions in aerospace medicine, often featuring astronauts, military leaders, NASA officials, aviation pioneers, and internationally recognized aerospace physicians.
