As of today, we have received **\$66,754.54** in offerings toward our **2025 budget of \$149,282.92**. This means we are a bit behind where we had hoped to be at this point in the year, but there is still time for us to stay on track together as a congregation.



Where We Stand

Average Monthly Giving (Jan-Aug): \$8,344 Needed Monthly Average (Sept-Dec): \$13,132

Our expenses are coming in close to budget, so any shortfall in giving will need to be covered by our cash savings.

I'm excited to see our church growing in activity this fall — with Sunday School starting back up, special events being planned, and more opportunities for worship and fellowship. Your giving helps make all of this possible.

A note from MLC president Tami Parker:

With the significant decline in monetary giving from members, it has left a challenging situation at present for MLC. Although Tiny Town has been a great asset to our church and we LOVE having them fill the basement with love and little voices, it is probably no surprise that it has also increased our overall expenses of the church. I wanted to give a breakdown of what council was presented with so that congregational members can understand the challenge we are faced with currently.

Couple additional bits: Water Bill: May 2025: \$233.84; June: \$339.61; July \$484.43 for an average of \$353.66. And note the water bill increased to \$593.16 in Aug 2025.

With these challenges, we had to reevaluate the lease. Past 2025 lease agreement, Tiny Town was paying rent equivalent to \$0.386 per square foot. Researching the avg rent per square footage of the Mayville area, it was found avg going commercial rate was anywhere from \$0.83 to \$2.00+ depending on condition of building. We as a council, did not feel the need to increase rent to that extent, but we took the approach of needing to at least meet our monthly needs. We felt it was a very fair approach to increase rent equivalent to \$0.525/square foot. We also gave an additional option of keeping rent the same but splitting utilities. Tiny Town elected to pay \$0.413/square foot and 50% of the utilities, which was mutually agreed upon. Additionally, we made clarifications regarding specific space allotment for the growing Tiny Town and addressed responsibility of needed repairs within the new lease.

Again, this decision was not an easy one. Council continues to wholeheartedly believe the addition of Tiny Town to our building has been so beneficial to our church in many ways and look forward to continuing our partnership. If anyone has any further questions, please reach out to either Richelle Mewes, or myself and we will answer as best as we can.

Serviced followed by music in the park has seemed to increase attendance and timing allows everyone to take in both events.
- *Thoughts on doing a Bluegrass service (communicating with Jay) at MLC sometime this winter. Stand alone performance. Outside organization does planning and organizing. May be nice to partner with.

New Business

- 1. New Router purchase- has corrected the issue. Working now. Wireless. Will have small charge from Business methods (who we rent printer from).
- 2. Updated lease for tiny town- Lease is up. Tiny Town's initial lease was that their rent would be less than 20% of income- recommended by lawyer and Mandi. Has been renting the space for four years. Church's use of basement is quite minimal. Council concern is that water and electricity expenses have increased, her rent is not covering this. Currently pays \$XXXX. Rent is due on the 1st of the Month.

Jess pulled some \$\$ together. Breaking up water, electrical, repairs. We'd like to have a better understanding of usage for Tiny Town (monthly)

Tami and Richelle will look over contract next week. Will share with council via email. Hoping to have ready for Mandi by Aug. 1.
- 3. September Rally Sunday Sept. 14 for both MLC and Gran. Tami has reached out to bouncy houses, Krista R willing to do cotton candy, maybe can have someone with face painting. Maybe have a food option for after service. BBQ? Hot dogs? Food truck? Grilling hot dogs prior may be easiest option.

Hot dogs, chips, water, cookies.

- 4. Fall community meal date/details: MaSU students? Athletes? Tami reached out to get information from vball coach about return date for athletes. Thinking it may be a good idea to have at the church in order to get people interested in coming to our church- letting them know they are welcome. Millers could maybe donate?? Richelle said they have done spaghetti in the past through donations. Volleyball assistant coach has been attending our church. So, maybe start with that sport?
 - *Megan Roller is in charge of activities at the college. Pastor feels that if we go to the college we are stepping out of our comfort and letting them see us and know we are comfortable reaching out. Tami expressed that having them come to us may break feelings of discomfort and get them through our doors initially.

^{*}Would like to visit with Mandi. Want to get on the same page and work out a contract so that the church is not losing money each month. We are okay breaking even, but would prefer to not lose each month. Contract needs to be worked out soon. Supposed to be August 1. Also would like to clarify space. Space on stage- needs to be used and designated for Sunday School. Don't use May-August. Perhaps include a date for space.

- 11. Update on MLC improvement plan: how are we doing?- Doing well. Event in May seemed to have gone over well. Happy with other events we have in mind.
- 12. Tiny Town space boundaries- covered above.
- 13. Update on Stain glass windows- completed?- Still need to fix the inside. Put on hold due to family circumstances. Historical- Toni Jacobson is willing to take pictures of stain glass windows for \$100. Can then have an explanation with the picture to use for different purposes.
