### ***Bible Study***

Join us for a unique way in which to experience the Bible. Faith Lessons from the DVD series *That the World May Know* with Ray Vander Laan take us to the actual places where the stories of the Bible occurred. The videos weave together historical, cultural, and geographical contexts to reveal keen insights into how people in biblical times understood God and Jesus' teaching. We also discuss the significance of the scriptures for believers today. Our first study is *Prophets and Kings*. By exploring the turbulent history of Israel's prophets and kings, we learn from their story how to build our own devotion and trust in God. Each session begins with sharing of prayer concerns and life experiences.

### ***Getting to the Heart of Parenting***

Parenting is hard, but there are few things in life that rise to this level of importance. God has chosen parents to be primary instruments in the shaping of a human soul. So often we get it wrong by using power to get our children to behave in certain ways. We establish laws and then play the role of police officer and judge. As Paul Tripp explains, parenting is so much deeper than rules and regulations. A biblical view teaches that parenting is all about the exposure and change of a child's heart. Permanent behavioral change only occurs when the heart of a person is changed by grace. *Getting to the Heart of Parenting* covers principles of grace for children 0-5, 6-12, and 13-18. Learn how to become an instrument of heart-

GriefShare is a special seminar and support group for people grieving the loss of someone close. Be with people who understand what you are experiencing and want to offer you comfort and encouragement. Each session consists of a video with insights, personal stories, and dramatic reenactments about the grief process. Discussion and sharing experiences help you organize and clarify your thoughts on what is happening to you and allow others to understand how they can help you. Both facilitators have experienced the loss of their husbands and have a deep understanding of what you are going through. With tender hearts and compassion, they walk with you. **Note that this is an extended class, beginning on September 12 and ending on December 5, and each session ends at 8:00 PM.**
