### ***Bible Study***

Join us for a unique way in which to experience the Bible. Faith Lessons from the DVD series *That the World May Know* with Ray Vander Laan take us to the actual places where the stories of the Bible occurred. The videos weave together historical, cultural, and geographical contexts to reveal keen insights into how people in biblical times understood God and Jesus' teaching. We also discuss the significance of the scriptures for believers today. Our first study is *Israel's Mission*. By learning about the assignment to bring back "lost sheep" that God gave to His people thousands of years ago, we glimpse the urgency and reward of welcoming the strangers and prodigals the Lord longs to embrace. *The Mission of Jesus* guides us on Jesus's path through Israel, while exploring the role of ancient Rome, and shows how God brought triumph in a world of chaos.

### ***The Wired Word***

How do Biblical principles apply to what is happening in our world today? *The Wired Word* links the latest headlines to appropriate scriptures. Each lesson consists of a current event, a framework for discussion, related scriptures with commentary (the substance of the lesson), and discussion questions. The lessons are based on a positive Christian theme. Meaningful, thoughtful discussions encourage participants to truly think about their beliefs and the impact of those beliefs on day-to-day life.

A core group of men is committed to creating a community of trust among men of all ages in our church. There may be off-site outreach projects, fun activities, and opportunities to hold one another accountable, as well as meeting together outside of Wednesday evenings. WNH is a time of study and discussion of characters from the Old Testament with Bill DeMora, Jack Diffendarfer, Marc Maly, and Mike Myers taking turns facilitating. Each session will start after clean-up of the Family Life Center. This group is open to all men who value interaction with other men, working, growing, and having fun together.

### ***Walk in Church***

*Walk at Home* videos by Leslie Sansone provide the motivation to exercise simply by stretching and walking. Beyond the physical benefits, exercise helps us relieve stress and can be a time when we direct our thoughts toward God. Since this is a group activity, participants have the opportunity to interact with one another while walking, building relationships. The videos offer a 1-mile walk (15 minutes), a 2-mile walk (30 minutes), and a 3-mile walk (45 minutes) and are appropriate for all ages and fitness levels. This group activity begins at 7:00 PM.
