A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

If I name just one mentor who helped me to become a pastor, it was Pastor Harry Pak, who was the senior pastor at Claremont United Methodist Church. This is the church located next to Claremont School of Theology (CST) while I was a student there. (Currently, CST is at Westwood UMC.) I started to work for a Master of Art in Religious Education degree. It was a logical choice of the degree and path to take since I

had been an elementary school teacher before I entered CST. Everyone agreed, except Pastor Pak. He kept asking me, "Have you thought about ordination?" No, I had not thought about ordination because it did not make sense that I was to become an ordained pastor. But that question bothered me enough to pray about it. Since it was God who told me to go to seminary, God would let me know if I was in the wrong program, I thought. And the prayer was answered with strong affirmative. About one year into the program, I changed my major to Master of Divinity and prepared for ordination as an Elder in the United Methodist Church. Pastor Pak became my official mentor, guiding me through the ordination process and exemplifying pastoral leadership.

One of his key teachings was that ministry involves "comforting the afflicted and afflicting the comfortable." This principle taught me that pastors must sometimes challenge congregants and address difficult truths, rather than seeking popularity. My subsequent training reinforced the dual role of pastors as both pastoral and prophetic—speaking truth in love while offering care and support. True ministry requires the courage to address uncomfortable realities and to listen, even when the message is difficult to accept. This prophetic role, as demonstrated in scripture, is often met with resistance but remains essential to authentic pastoral leadership. We are often tempted to conceal or ignore aspects of ourselves that we find troubling; however, avoidance does not resolve these issues. My training affirmed that genuine ministry requires the courage to speak the truth and to do so with compassion.

As I was preparing for, leading, and reflecting after the All-Saints' Day worship service, I remembered my mentor pastor. I regret I had not spent more time with him before he passed away. But his spirit has been with me, especially in the last few days. I remain deeply grateful for the guidance and example set by Pastor Pak. His care and teaching continue to inspire my ministry and personal growth.
