

# Shepherd's Corner

The Holy Family

Dear St. Hedwig Family:

In the Catholic Church, the month of February is dedicated to the Holy Family. Therefore, I would like to reflect on three qualities of the Holy Family for us to imitate. First, the Holy Family was poor. St. Joseph and Mary were considered as belonging to a group of poor, pious Jews called the *Anawim*. These were poor, devout Jews who were often overlooked and oppressed by the wealthy and powerful. Not having many resources, they looked to God for protection, sustenance and to right injustices. St. Joseph was a carpenter working with his hands and earning a meager income. Tradition has it that the Holy Family would give one-third of their income to the temple, one-third to the poor, and kept one-third to provide for

their own needs. Jesus was born poor, lived poor, and died poor -- showing us that God values the lowly, simple, and humble. When we have too much of the luxuries, materialism, and pleasures of the world we can become dulled to our need for God.

It follows that the Holy Family was focused and faithful to God. We read in Scripture that St. Joseph and Mary would observe the laws and practices expected of the Jewish people. They were faithful to the Lord in practice and in prayer. Tradition has it that the members of the Holy Family would pray individually and together as a family. They would read, study and reflect on Scripture together. Mary, in her *Magnificat*, shows that she is very familiar with the Hebrew Bible because her words reflect the writings of Scripture. Are we faithful in observing the laws and practices of our faith? Do we pray individually and together as a family? Do we read, study, and reflect on the Word of God? The Holy Family shows us the importance of simplifying our lives, refraining from immersing ourselves in the world, and to dedicate our life to prayer, worship, and observing the Lord's teachings.

Lastly, the individuals of the Holy Family sought to know God's will for them and to embrace and live out their vocation according to God's plan. St. Joseph accepted that he was called to the husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus. He lived out his role to the best of his ability by providing for the family, protecting them from danger, and trusting in God's providence. Mary also accepted her role as the wife of St. Joseph and the mother of Jesus by taking care of her family and accepting all the sufferings that her family would endure. Jesus, although he was God, was obedient to Mary and St. Joseph and lived out his mission perfectly. We too should seek God's will for us and for our family and try to live out our role and vocation as best we can according to God's plan. That includes accepting who we are, our limitations, and the sacrifices that are asked of us. Like the Holy Family, may we not pursue our own desires, but the glory of God and the salvation of souls. As we mediate on the life and virtue of the Holy Family and imitate them, may our families become more and more pleasing to God.


## Celebration of World Marriage Day - February 11, 2024




