Many of you may have heard of Caitlin Clark by now. She is the best player in women's college basketball right now and perhaps of all times. Clark plays for the Iowa Hawkeyes, which is the same state where she grew up Catholic and played at a Catholic High School. I am impressed not just with her talent but with how she handles herself on and off the court. She is humble, works hard, and is filled with joy and enthusiasm. I think that Caitlin Clark is a great model for young girls. Iowa will take on the University of Connecticut in the Final Four Tournament on Friday, April 5, with the winner advancing to the championship game on Sunday, April 7.

The best player for the University of Connecticut is Paige Bueckers, who is also a superstar in her own right. What I like about Bueckers, is that she is open about her Christian faith. When she is interviewed, she gives credit to God and thanks the Lord for all that he has done for her. She prays and makes the sign of the cross while on the court. Bueckers too is humble, hardworking, and not afraid to bear witness to Christ in a world that frowns upon religion, especially Christianity.

As I was searching for women's college basketball players who are Catholic, the name Shelly Pennefather came up. Pennefather played college basketball for Villanova University in the 1980's and was awarded the best player in women's college basketball player in the country in 1987. After playing professional women's basketball in Japan for a few years, she answered God's call and joined the Poor Clares Monastery in Alexandria, Virginia in 1991 and became Sr. Rose Marie. Lastly, about six months ago, I was searching for a Catholic movie to watch, and I came across, *The Mighty Macs*. This movie is based on the true story of *Immaculata College* – a small all women's Catholic college in Pennsylvania – and their basketball team that won the championship in 1972. Even in the world of women's college basketball, the Lord is working through individuals and teams to inspire and bring others to come to know him, love him, and praise him.

Divine Mercy Sunday focuses on the gift of mercy and love given through Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. "Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified," said Pope John Paul II.

Month of April is dedicated to the Eucharist

Holy Eucharist, simply is Christ's body, blood, soul, and divinity under the appearance of bread and wine. It is not a symbol of Christ, but rather, it truly is Jesus Christ.

At the point in the Mass, known as the consecration, the priest, acting in persona Christi, will say "*This is my Body, which will be give up for you*" and "*This is my Blood.*" These were the words of Our Saviour when He turned the bread and wine, at the Last Supper, into His Body and Blood, and, by the divine power of God in the priesthood, the bread and wine become Jesus Christ.

Clearly, we need Jesus as He is the "only way, truth, and life," and it is in the Most Holy Eucharist that the distance between Heaven and Earth is the shortest and we receive Our Lord, Most High. That intimate moment can not be put into words as it is only the soul that speaks with such fervent love that some are moved to tears.

Let us spend this month in prayer to our Lord to share with us the intimate relationship that He desires us to have with Him.
