Q.1. What is your only comfort in life and in death?

Metanoia Prison Ministry

Metanoia Prison Ministry serves the incarcerated. Through discipleship, mentoring, and reintegration programs, Metanoia serves the prisoner and the local church by equipping church members with resources to meet the needs of those who are witnesses for Christ while incarcerated. Dan Cooke is the regional director of Metanoia for Virginia and North Carolina. In this role, Dan has been making connections with local prisons and other prison ministries to facilitate the local church in serving men and women in Virginia prisons. Metanoia Corresponding Discipleship Ministry is another branch of Metanoia's outreach. Inmates who sign up for the program commit to completing a Bible study program authored by Ligonier Ministries. Participant inmates are matched with Christians who commit to prayer, grading their course work, and offering encouragement through letter writing.
