THE NEED FOR GROUPS

You are five times more likely to stay in a church if you join a group. Here are the facts. Eighty-three percent of people will stay in a church if they attend worship services and also join a group. However, only 16 percent of people will stay in the church if they attend a worship service only and never join a group. Most people start attending a church through the worship service, but most people stay in a church because of their connection to a group.

"Seven Basics of Belonging" author, Sam Rainer, highlights how crucial groups are to the church today. As we continue in this season of revitalization here at FPC, we have found Sam's words to ring true to our own experiences too. THE WESTMINSTER LARGER CATECHISM

Q. 53. How was Christ exalted in his ascension?

Christ's exaltation in his ascension began after his resurrection when he appeared to the apostles a number of times, talked to them about the kingdom of God,¹ and commissioned them to preach the gospel to all nations.² Forty days after his resurrection, in our human nature and as our head,³ he visibly went up into the highest heavens, triumphing over enemies.⁴ There he receives gifts for men,⁵ raises our minds,6 and prepares a place for us,7 where he himself is and shall continue to be until his second coming at the end of the world.8

A. Sitting at the right hand of God exalts Christ as the Godman; he is advanced to the highest favor with God the Father¹ with all the joy,² glory,³ and power of this position over all things in heaven and earth.⁴ There Christ gathers and defends his church, subdues her enemies, provides his ministers and people with gifts and graces,⁵ and intercedes for them.⁶

The doctor will be attempting to clean out the blockage, insert a stent or replace the veins. Shortly after that surgery he will have the same type of surgery on his right leg which has one completely blocked vein.

May 9th Dick Nord is having a heart implant (Watchman) in his left Ventricular Appendage at Reid Hospital to eliminate the need to continue on blood thinners and to almost eliminate the possibility of having a stroke from clotted blood in that appendage.

First Presbyterian Church of Greenville Ohio Minutes of the Session of April 13, 2023

I. Opening

A. Call meeting to order with reading of the Word and prayer

The April 2023 stated meeting of the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Greenville was called to order on April 13, 2023, at First Presbyterian Church at 7 PM by Pastor Andrew Gilman. Pastor Gilman opening the meeting with prayer.

Members Present: Pam Bowman, Wes Jetter, Craig Leland, Randy Tester, Peter Haviza and Helen Miller (6)

Members Absent: Jan Roestamadji

Guests: Dan Hawley, Elaine Snyder, and Tish Shepherd

Approval of Agenda A motion was made to approve the docket. Peter Haviza made the motion seconded by Pam Bowman and passing 6-0.

Approval of Minutes Randy Tester motioned to approve the March 2023 minutes with a correction that sections of the minutes dealing with the voicing of concerns be eliminated. This motion was seconded by Peter Haviza. The motion passed 6-0.

II. Agenda Items

Testimonies of Faith At 7:15 the session turned its attention to testimonies of faith given by Dan Hawley, Elaine Snyder and Tish Shepherd. After hearing these statements of faith, the session then voted to accept all three individuals into our church. A motion was made by Peter Haviza to just make one vote accepting all 3 into the church body. This motion was seconded by Pam Bowman and passed 6-0.

Financial Report Craig Leland presented the financial report. Highlights of his report included mentioning that gift contributions were \$11,755.76 in March 2023. Year to date giving is \$36,945.76. Outside of those numbers, he had nothing out of the ordinary to report. Pam Bowman motioned to accept this report seconded by Wes Jetter and passing 6-0.

Renovation Project John Vehre briefly reported on the renovation project. I mentioned that after talking with Dustin Nealeigh, with Bruns Construction, that the project would not commence until late August. John also mentioned that the final plans had been submitted to the church incorporating changes made in the last meeting between the renovation committee, Bruns and Garman Miller.

Mission Committee Wes Jetter reported that Christa and Sam, who First Presbyterian helps support would like to visit our church on July 14, 2023. Wes also mentioned to help build up support for Missionary work that he would like to have a cookout for the Mission Committee at his house sometime this summer.

Worship Committee A schedule of communion days, ushers and servers has been drawn up for the next few months.

Education Committee (Randy Tester) A motion was made to create a scholarship commission by Randy Tester. The motion's wording went as follows: *The elders hereby grant authority to Randy Tester for the formation of a Commission of Scholarship Review and Award. The Commission is given authority to decide which applicants will receive the various scholarship awards through FPC. This Commission is established April 14, 2023 and its purview will conclude May 31, 2023. The following names are included on this commission: Elder Randy Tester, Congregants Paige Ervin, Amanda Hines, Kathy Lockhart and Elder Jan Roestamadji. The motion was seconded by Pam Bowman and passed 6-0.*

Pastor's Report (Andrew Gilman – written submission) Pastor Gilman submitted a written report of his activities for March. In addition, Andrew mentioned that he will now be heading the youth mission trip to Niagara Falls, New York that will be taking place from June 4-9, 2023. He is requesting to be able to prepare a sermon for the Sunday following the trip, that he be allowed to book a room for three nights. (The rest of the group, both adults and children, will be staying at a location provided by the church group we are helping, with rough and rather basic accommodations.) Wes Jetter motioned to accept this proposal, seconded by Craig Leland. The motion passed 6-0. After reviewing the Pastor's report, Peter Haviza motioned to accept it, seconded by Pam Bowman. The motion passed 6-0.

Deacon's Meeting The Deacon's did submit a written report. After reviewing it Randy Tester made a motion to accept it. His motion was seconded by Helen Miller, and it passed 6-0.

III. Closing

Prayer. A closing prayer was made by Pam Bowman.

Adjournment. Peter Haviza motioned to adjourn, which was seconded by Craig Leland. The motion passed 6-0.

THE NEED FOR GROUPS (CONT.)

Doing life together, as God's people, is best facilited through small group ministries. To be certain, our main point of connection as a church body is our Sunday Worship time. However, there are opportunities provided by small groups that the larger church setting is not best suited for.

Here are 5 ways that small groups will help our congregation in our relationships and our ministry to invite others into our church.

1. Small groups foster close relationships and integral community. The small group atmosphere is ready-made for building friendships. People talk more in small groups of people. People are quick to recognize needs, and help to meet them. The relationships formed within small groups form a strong fabric within a church. Relationships that are formed outside of the (sometimes artificial) setting of a church service, are relationships that will endure and strengthen over time.

Relationships are such an important way that God works in the lives of His people. It is important to build strong relationships with fellow believers and to open our lives to each other as we pursue the Lord.

2. Small groups provide a comfortable atmosphere for openness. One thing I like about small groups is that we meet in homes, or living room settings. There are at least twenty-six references in the New Testament that talk about believers meeting in homes or being part of a household. (Not all are references in Acts: Romans 16:5; 1 Corinthians 16:19; Philemon 1:2). Homes are usually comfortable places—places devoid of pews, PA systems, and stages. They are places where people can open up, listen, learn, and grow.

The location of small groups can be just about anywhere. However, the idea of meeting together in each other's homes is a particularly nice way to get to know each other in a setting that is welcoming and conducive to sharing life together.

3. Small groups encourage better learning.

Listening to a sermon is a great way to learn the Word, but it is easy to become detached or daydream during a sermon. We become passive listeners. Not so in a small group. When a few people are together, every individual is expected to be involved and to participate. This active involvement is an effective way to learn better.

Often, the Sunday sermons have enough to think about in them that it would be helpful to jot down some notes for later. Discussing your sermon notes and talking them over with others who are wrestling with the same ideas always provides more clarity. We all need more time engaging with God's Word than just Sunday morning for 30 minutes. This gives us a great chance to talk through our questions and learn more from other believers.

4. Small groups provide an ideal way to care for the needs of people within the church.

When one believer in a small group is struggling financially, emotionally, spiritually, socially, etc., it is much easier for the members of the group to notice and provide help. The structure of a small group is essentially a community of believing friends. Friends should help one another, especially Christian friends.

Caring for each other's needs is an important part of any church. The closer we are to people who love us—the easier it is for that group of people to pray for us, and to find resources to help in times of need. People who are outside of the church and who do not know God will find this way of being together particularly winsome and impressive. They too are looking for a place where real authentic relationships are being built.

5. Small groups help to cultivate leadership within the church. Small groups give opportunities for leadership development within the church. Through our small groups we will communicate the core ideas of membership at FPC and our mission to reach those around us with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The purpose of our church is to reach people with the love of Jesus. God put us here, at this time, in this place, to accomplish the specific task of sharing our lives with those who we live among. We live among our families, our co-workers, our friends, and acquaintances. God wants to use you to reach these people with the good news of Jesus. The small group ministries of the church

will increasingly become the place where you can invite your people into a friendly and safe atmosphere where they can begin to meet other Christians and hear about Jesus for the first time.

This summer please pray about the need to be part of a small group ministry. We have groups that meet once a week, twice a month, and once a month. We have groups that meet at the church or in homes. We have groups that meet to do service and others that meet to study God's Word. We want every member of FPC to be a member of a small group.


