First Presbyterian Church of Greenville Ohio Minutes of the Session of July 13, 2023

I. Opening

A. Call meeting to order with reading of the Word and prayer

The July 2023 stated meeting of the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Greenville was called to order on July 13, 2023, at First Presbyterian Church at 7 PM by Pastor Andrew Gilman. Pastor Gilman opening the meeting with prayer.

Members Present: Pam Bowman, Wes Jetter, Jan Roestamadji (After 7:20), Randy Tester, Peter Haviza and Helen Miller (6)

Members Absent: Craig Leland

Guests: Alex Thomas, Shannon Thomas, and Don Stevenson

Approval of Agenda A motion was made to approve the docket. Pam Bowman made the motion seconded by Peter Haviza and passing 5-0.

Approval of Minutes Helen Miller motioned to approve the June 2023. This motion was seconded by Pam Bowman. The motion passed 5-0.

II. Agenda Items

Financial Report Don Stevenson presented the financial report giving information both for May and June 2023. Report was voted on in two segments, one segment for each month. Highlights of his May report included mentioning that gift contributions were \$18,119.25. He presented new expenses for phone service (Internet phones), Insurance costs that he also noted were up 11%. Additionally, there were 2 utility bills in May and YTD giving is \$76,081.11. Peter Haviza motioned to approve the May information, seconded by Wes Jetter and passing 6-0. (By now, Jan Roestamadji was present for this vote.)

For June, Don noted gift contributions were \$10,137.30. He volunteered that not all mission expenses were in yet. An amount of \$32,194.49 is mentioned as other income. This money came from the cashing out of the Don Nease "house" estate where the church in previous years had been receiving annual income from an individual residing near the park. Don also mentioned that the Presbytery refunded \$379.74 for expenses related to a brochure Andrew was working on for that organization. A fee of \$22.25 was noted for copier lease maintenance, a cost that is charged when a certain level of copies have been made. Other expenses that Don presented included \$150.00 for Design Outreach, \$661.51 related to a recent mission trip, \$216.00 for Christian Education and \$578.99 for Vacation Bible School expenses. Overall, the church still remains roughly \$1,000 ahead of budget. Peter Haviza motioned to accept the June information, seconded by Helen Miller and passing by a margin of 6-0.

Testimonies of Faith At 7:15 the session turned its attention to testimonies of Faith given by Alex and Shannon Thomas. After hearing these statements of faith, the session then voted to accept the Thomas's into our church. The motion was made by Peter Haviza, was seconded by Pam Bowman, and passed 6-0.

Mission Committee Wes Jetter again reported that Christa and Sam Lloyd, who First Presbyterian helps support will be visiting our church on July 14, 2023. There will be a presentation by the couple at Wes and Patti Jetter's house from 5-7 PM, and Wes encourages Session and other church members to attend. Wes also reported that Kaley Hill, who is currently studying at Bowling Green University, is looking for contributions towards mission work. Kaley Hill's family are former members of the church but are no longer active. He does not recommend an ongoing contribution, but instead suggests the church give one lump sum contribution. No vote was taken at this time, although the request will be considered in a future meeting.

Pastor's Report (Andrew Gilman - written submission) Pastor Gilman submitted a written report of his

activities for June. In the consideration of the lateness of the hour, Andrew only verbally mentioned attending a viewing for the family of Chris Mumaw and mentioning a vacation that he took to St. Louis from July 3-8. Pam Bowman motioned to accept the report, seconded by Jan Roestamadji and passing 6-0.

Furniture and Item list for retirement Andrew Gilman submitted a list of items that the staff recommend removing from the church prior to the upcoming building renovation project projected for September 2023. The session reviewed the list and with a few modifications voted to accept it. Jan Roestamadji made the motion, seconded by Peter Haviza and passing 6-0.

Deacon's Meeting No report was submitted in July.

III. Closing

Prayer. A closing prayer was made by Jan Roestamadji.

Adjournment. Pam Bowman motioned to adjourn, which was seconded by Helen Miller. The motion passed 6-0.

Special Session Meeting to Discuss Sidewalk Replacement July 23, 2023

Attending: Craig Leland, Pam Bowman, Randy Tester, and Jan Roestamadji. (4)

Opening Prayer: Andrew Gilman

Sidewalk Project: Craig Leland presented details for sidewalk repairs that the city of Greenville is requiring the Church to commit to prior to July 31, 2023. The projected costs estimated by the city include replacement of 3 sections of sidewalk with an estimated cost of \$3,166.00 and adding a driveway section off of the alleyway behind the church with an estimated cost of \$2,750.00. These prices reflect what the city will bill when they bid out the project, which will take place sometime within the next year. The city also mentioned that the price of the project can be paid out over a 5-year period. Craig also reported that he had approached Justin Hine to obtain a cost comparison. Justin does not do such work himself, but has approached a friend who does do such work. We do not have an estimate for that cost during the July 23, 2023, but it is possible an estimate could arrive prior to the July 31, 2023 deadline set by the city. With that information in mind Pam Bowman motioned to accept the city's proposal with the proviso that a lower estimate is not received before the July 31, 2023 deadline. This motion was seconded by Randy Tester and passed by a margin of 4-0.

We will resume our children's church curriculum as well as small group ministries. We will also have a carry in meal in the fellowship hall immediately following the service on September 10th.

Regarding small group ministries, we feel strongly that relationships are an important part of belonging to a church. The small group ministries of FPC are the perfect place to get to know your brothers and sisters in the Lord. These are also places where you have the opportunity to grow in your faith through various modes of study. We have discussion groups, video series, book studies and more. Please inquire about small groups in the church office or by talking with Pastor Andrew.

The second item on our agenda to discuss at the congregational meeting was the upcoming renovation project. After many months of preparation behind the scenes the project is on the move once more. The contractor and his team have been on site and are beginning the initial stages of preparation.

You may have noticed the furniture and other items at the church that we are beginning to clear out from the church. We are making space for some new items coming soon. Many people in the congregation have identified items they want to have via the binder and photos in the narthex.

The process of moving furniture in preparation for the project will begin in earnest in the first two weeks of September. Part of this big move, includes the offices. The office will be relocated to the second floor next to the library. In order to hear the doorbell we ask that you use the small doorbell on the left side of the main entrance rather than the electronic doorway to the left next to the security pad. We will try to make clear signage reminding you of this change. If you are concerned with stairs-do not worry. The staff will meet you at the door and do whatever we can to assist you without requiring a trip upstairs. The chapel and the parlor will be left as is and those spaces will be available for meetings throught the renovations.

If you have a child in preschool or younger, please note, their classroom will be moved to the "Senior High" room upstairs throughout renovations. Also, due to the renovations, the Deacons' will not hold a fall fundraise. However, please know your donations towards their ministry is welcomed at any time throughout the year.

Some other parts of our fall schedule will be adjusted slightly due to the renovation project too. The first thing to note is that the stewardship campaign and prayer vigil will be taking place on the last weekend of September/first weekend of October. On Saturday September 30th you will have the opportunity to sign up for a prayer vigil slot. As always, there will be two (possibly three) locations available to pray; the sanctuary, the chapel and the library.* Year after year this seems to always be a spiritually renewing time for those who participate. We encourage newer members who have not taken part before, to consider signing up this year for a spot in the sanctuary.

We are excited to see the youth group returning to FPC this fall, led by Brandon and Kelsey Ervin. They are planning to utilize the old high school youth room after the younger children are back into their regular classrooms. These meetings will take place every 2nd and 4th Monday of the month.

The renovation project is scheduled for completion in the first week of February of 2024; just in time for Presbytery. Please be in prayer that this schedule holds since we will be in need of our entire facility for that meeting. Please also be in prayer for the ongoing mission of the church to reach people with the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Finally, as your pastor, I am in prayer for you all, always, and I invite you to reach out with specific prayer requests through the "Cast your Cares Challege" we will be kicking off soon. Please read more about this challege on page 4. I look forward to being more involved in your lives in this way. I can honestly say that I have seen God answer so many of our prayers these past 4 years. He is so wise and kind to us. Your prayers and your support are an extension of your trust and obedience to Jesus Christ and I thank you.


