Dear Friends,

Wonderfully, miraculously, it is still Easter! Yesterday, we celebrated a joyous day of music, fellowship, laughter, and beautiful weather. Today, the celebration is a little quieter, but remains as we celebrate Easter for the next 7ish weeks.

The Season of Easter, or Eastertide, is the 50 day period between the Resurrection of the Lord and the Day of Pentecost. For churchgoers, Easter is not simply a one day event but the longest special season in the liturgical calendar (second only to the stretch of Ordinary Time in the summer). The season of Easter is time for us to examine what it means to live in a world where resurrection is possible—resurrection from the grave, from despair, from oppression, from poverty. Questions we might ask ourselves in this season could be:

- How does it change my perspective to know that God's love is stronger than death?
- How have I experienced resurrection in my own heart?
- Who do I know that needs to hear the good news of Easter?
- Who among my neighbors might need help experiencing God's promise of life, and how can I help them?
- What in my world might need to pass away in order to be raised as something new and holy?
- How can I lean into Easter joy for more than just one day?

We do a good job of focusing on Lent as a season of penitence and preparation; I would argue that it is just as important to focus on Eastertide as a season of joyful reflection and proclamation that "I have seen the Lord!" I'm looking forward to approaching this special season at BRPC with curiosity, reverence, and praise!




## **DEACON NEWS**

# **MISSIONS & OUTREACH**

Thanks to your support of Sloppy Joe Café last October, the Mission and Outreach Committee was able to disperse funds to several charities, including NOROC (an orphanage in Romania), Presbyterian schools in Pakistan, Shepherds Center, Newhouse and Raytown Summer Lunch Ministry. We look forward to another Sloppy Joe Cafe this fall. During coffee fellowship in September and October, we will hold a Mission Fair to highlight the charities Sloppy Joe Café supports.

#### THE EXTRA SECOND

#### SOUTH ENTRANCE RAILING

Our Property Committee continues to work on replacement of the missing railing at the south entrance steps. Many companies are not able to do the work for various reasons, but we continue to seek additional contractors and hope to have the project completed soon. Thank you for your patience. Please be careful when entering and exiting through the south door.

#### PROJECTS

Other committee projects include: having preemergent applied to portions of the lawn; seeding and fertilizing problem areas on the north; watering the new grass; adding rock to the enclosed area around the AC units on the west; researching potential rock in landscape areas of the grounds; removing the former trash enclosure; repairing the steeple base siding; repairing the motion light switch in the Fellowship Hall; meeting with contractors; choosing paint colors for various projects; creating a new name tag board for the narthex; researching enhanced use of the northwest porch; examining the status of concrete areas; processing building use requests as they come in and coordinating with various groups using our facilities; etc. If you see a problem or have a concern, please let a Property Committee member know or place a note in Bobby Neal's mailbox. 
