



God is Just

God's grace is such that He makes Himself known. God has revealed his attributes in two ways. The first is through what He has made. But that knowledge is also limited. That's why God reveals his character, not just by what He made, but also by what He wrote. He has given us the Bible, and the Bible is crammed cover to cover with information about who God is, what God loves, what God hates, and what God's like. In these next seven sessions, we will explore God's attributes as they are revealed in His word. Once you really understand what God is like, you will never be the same. The world is overrun with religions, philosophies, and personal opinions regarding the nature and character of God. Left to our own devices, we typically make God in our own image and make Him into the kind of God we want. We are not left to figure God out on our own. Through the Bible, God has revealed Himself to us. Through the revelation of Scripture—and His ultimate revelation through Jesus Christ—we can see exactly who God is. And when we see Him, we are drawn to worship Him.
