Nurturing Contentment

Charles Spurgeon said in one of his sermons, "If you are not content with what you have, you would not be satisfied if it were doubled."

On the brink of the biggest consumer-driven months in America, how do you teach children to be content in Christ?

When it comes to "contentment" in the Bible, you can't avoid Philippians 4:11-13. Perhaps the first step in realizing contentment is to understand we can't do it on our own. And then the best way to teach our children contentment is to .. you guessed it .. practice it ourselves. We need to ask God for His guidance.

I've found that when we seek wisdom from God, He'll meet us in a very practical way. For me, it came in the form of a book called "How to Raise Selfless Kids in a Self-Centered World" by Pastor Dave Stone.

If your children see you being more concerned about spiritual disciplines than earthly possessions, they too will experience greater contentment.
