Confession of Sins


Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.

Nicene Creed


■ I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.


Distribution Hymn: We Walk by Faith and Not By Sight

Distribution Hymn: What is This Bread?


