Stated Clerk Sandy Thoits confirmed a quorum was present.

Motion to grant privilege of floor to Corresponding Members and Committee Members. **Approved**

Motion to Adopt the Agenda as distributed, with 2 changes. **Approved**

Motion to adopt the Consent Agenda (attached) as distributed, with one change: The motion regarding members for Safe Harbor NCD to be made as part of the Church Development Committee Report. **Approved**

February 9, 2019, Presbytery Minutes were approved with the Consent Agenda.

Rev. Bob Crouch, Pastor, Pismo Beach Presbyterian Church, welcomed the Presbytery, shared about the 95 years of Presbyterian Church ministry in Pismo Beach and read from the Church history book. Moderator Tamara Skov expressed gratitude to the Pismo Beach Church for hosting the meeting.

Report of the Stated Clerk. Elder Sandy Thoits, Stated Clerk, announced that the Presbytery is seeking nominations for two Commissioners (1 teaching elder and 1 ruling elder) and one Young Adult Advisory Delegate (YAAD) to the 2020 General Assembly in Baltimore. Nomination Forms are available. The election is scheduled for the September 21, 2019 Presbytery Meeting. The Stated Clerk called attention to the *Recommendation on Plan for Parity between Teaching Elders and Ruling Elders at Presbytery Meetings*, For Presbytery Approval – May 18, 2019, Effective as of the September 21, 2019 Presbytery Meeting – Included in the Consent Agenda for this meeting and attached to these Minutes. Please note the changes for your church in the number of Ruling Elder Commissioners for Presbytery Meetings beginning at the September 21, 2019 Presbytery Meeting.

Presbytery Adjourned to Celebration of Worship, with message given by Rev. Bob Crouch. Ruling Elder Susan Freer assisted in worship.

Presbytery reconvened.

Treasurer's Report. Scott Eschbach, Chair of the Property and Finance Committee presented the Treasurer's Report.

-- *2019 First Quarter Financial Report:* Elder Scott Eschbach reviewed several operation items from the written Presbytery Profit & Loss Financial Report, January – March, 2019. The Balance Sheet is in process with the Presbytery auditors. Highlands Church is current in payments to the Presbytery for the mortgage on the church site property.

Motion to receive the report, Profit & Loss Financial Report, January – March, 2019, seconded. **Approved**

Planning Team Update. Rev. Dan Stevens, Chair of Planning Team. Rev. Dan Stevens reported on the areas of current work by the team: Helping to connect churches with churches and sharing of “Bright Spots.” Visiting with church Sessions to gather input and hear about ideas to share with other churches. A new Presbytery Newsletter is in process, with a new format. Presbytery staffing input on models and needs is being gathered, with a staffing proposal to go to Council in the next few months.

Report of Presbytery Council. Rev. Dennis Falasco, Council Chair

-- *Motion Regarding Designation of El Montecito Dismissal Funds.* Rev. Dennis Falasco, called on Rev. Tom Stephen, member of Presbytery Council, who introduced a motion recommended by Presbytery Council for approval by Presbytery, regarding designation of a portion of the initial payment of funds by El Montecito Presbyterian Church to the Presbytery pursuant to the Dismissal Agreement with El Montecito. The following **Motion** was made, seconded **Approved**

- Motion Regarding Designation of El Montecito Dismissal Funds: Council at its April 3 meeting reviewed the topic of designation of the use of funds from the dismissal agreement with El Montecito Presbyterian Church. Presbytery has not

yet determined any designation for use of these funds. A motion for specific distributions of a portion of El Montecito Dismissal Funds was approved by Council to recommend approval by Presbytery at the May 18, 2019 Presbytery meeting, as follows: That, from the original down payment amount of \$350,000, in dismissal funds from El Montecito Presbyterian Church, specific distributions shall be paid, as follows:

- A one-time title (\$36,000) to be divided between the following recipients:
 - IMPACT - \$12,000
 - Mission Conference - \$12,000
 - Front Porch - \$12,000

-- *Update on Dismissal Process for Lompoc Presbyterian Church.* Rev. Dennis Falasco reported that the Lompoc Church has asked to proceed with the Gracious Dismissal Process. Council will designate a Presbytery Response Team (PRT) and inform the church of the PRT members.

-- *Gender and Leadership in the PC(USA).* Rev. Janet Loughry and Rev. David Anderson introduced and referred to two items in the packet for this meeting from the Presbyterian Church (USA): “Gender & Leadership in the PC(USA) – Summary of Findings” and the February 2019 Letter from the Advocacy Committee on Women’s Concerns (ACWC) Presbyterian Church (U.S.A). Council has asked that this topic and findings be brought to the attention of Presbytery and members and church leaders are encouraged to review the summary and letter. Janet Loughry, David Anderson, Kate Wiebe and the Clergy Support Committee members are available to meet with anyone with questions, concerns or who feels they would like to meet.

CORN/Nominations.

- *Nomination/Election of Moderator 2019-2020.* Moderator Tamar Skov brought forth a nomination from the committee for Presbytery Moderator for 2019-2020: **Motion** to nominate Rev. Tom Stephen to serve as Presbytery Moderator for 2019-2020. Rev. Dennis Falasco spoke in favor of the nomination. The Moderator asked for nominations from the floor, none were given. Motion and election of Rev. Tom Stephen for Moderator 2019-2020 **Approved**
- *Nominations/Election of Committee Members.* Rev. Tom Stephen, Chair of CORN, referred to the Nominations list in the packet distributed, individuals nominated and terms shown in yellow highlight, and asked for any nominations from the floor. No nominations were given from the floor. Discussion on ideas of ways to expand involvement by ruling elders in churches on Presbytery Committees. Elders already involved in Presbytery are encouraged to share this need with their Sessions and elders in their churches. **Motion** from committee to approve the nominations as listed and elect the committee members as listed on the report (attached to these Minutes). **Approved**

Committee Reports and Motions.

- **Committee on Ministry.** Rev. Jeff Holland.

- Rev. Holland presented the Committee's recommendation to examine Rev. Charles Svendsen for membership in the Presbytery of Santa Barbara, as Interim Pastor at First Presbyterian Church, Santa Barbara, to start as of July 1, 2019. Rev. Svendsen is currently a minister member in good standing at Los Ranchos Presbytery. Rev. Svendsen read his Statement of Faith and responded to questions from the Presbytery and then was excused from the room. A **motion** from the committee was made that Rev. Charles Svendsen be enrolled as an active member of the Presbytery of Santa Barbara upon his dismissal from the Los Ranchos Presbytery. **Approved**
 - Rev. Holland reported that Rev. Eugenia Gamble, Pastor at Nipomo Community Presbyterian Church requested to move to Honorably Retired status and COM brings a motion to move Rev. Gamble to Honorably Retired status as of July 1, 2019. **Approved.**
- **Property and Finance.** Written Report provided.
 - **Clergy Support.** Rev. Janet Loughry reported that she has been going around and meeting with the church Pastors and will soon be setting up meetings to check in with Associate Pastors.
 - **Disaster Response Task Force.** Rev. Suzanne Malloy, Chair, reviewed gatherings and events in response to the disasters over the past year, and participation along with ICTG in the Santa Barbara County Community Wellness Team, which received an award Resolution expressing gratitude from the County of Santa Barbara.

Lunch. The Presbytery dismissed for lunch at 11:30am and reconvened at 12:30pm.

Committee Reports and Motions.

-- **Church in the World/Missions.** CRE Chuck Curtis announced that the Santa Barbara Mission Conference is scheduled for the last weekend in January, 2020. He introduced and showed video presentation of the commissioning service of the Impact mission teams for 2019.

-- **Church Development Committee (CDC).** *Safe Harbor NCD.* Elder Lee Kirkpatrick, member CDC, shared about the progress in ministry and work of the dedicated leadership and participants at Safe Harbor NCD in Cambria, several of whom had been members of Cambria Presbyterian Church (dismissed to ECO) and chose to remain members in the PC(USA). The following **motion** from the Committee was presented and **Approved:**

That the following persons be received into membership of the Presbytery of Santa Barbara for Safe Harbor Presbyterian Church, Cambria, a New Church Development (NCD) of the Presbytery of Santa Barbara.

- The following former members of Community Presbyterian Church of Cambria who chose to retain membership in the PC(USA) in the Presbytery

of Santa Barbara effective as of November 10, 2015, the date of Presbytery approval of the dismissal of Community Presbyterian Church of Cambria to ECO: A Covenant Order of Presbyterians. - Move to set aside Standing Rule 6.51- Committee on Ministry until the November 12, 2019 Presbytery Meeting, to allow time to bring the committee membership in compliance with one-half Teaching Elders and one-half Ruling Elders.
- Move to set aside Standing Rule 6.52 - Committee for Preparation for Ministry until the November 12, 2019, Presbytery Meeting to bring committee membership into compliance of a minimum of 4 members and one-half Teaching Elders and one-half Ruling Elders.
- Move to set aside Standing Rule 6.61 – Personnel Committee until the November 12, 2019, Presbytery Meeting to bring committee membership into compliance with 6 members and one-half Teaching Elder and one-half Ruling Elders.

- Reports that, as directed by Presbytery Council, the Stated Clerk on March 28, 2019 mailed letters to all 11 churches previously dismissed from the Presbytery to confirm compliance continued with membership and use of real property with a qualifying reformed denomination, pursuant to the dismissal agreement with each church. As of May 7, 2019, letters have been received by the following churches all confirming compliance and membership in the ECO: A Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians: Community Presbyterian Ventura, Morro Bay Pres. Church, Orchard Pres. Church, Malibu Pres. Church, First Pres. Templeton, Orcutt Pres. Church, Cottonwood Church (Los Alamos), Cambria Community Pres., El Montecito Pres. Church, Trinity Pres. Camarillo. Response pending from: Santa Ynez Valley Pres.
- Reports that the Stated Clerk, on March 13, 2019, emailed all Clerks of Session with the letter from the Advocacy Committee for Women’s Concerns (ACWC) the “Gender and Leadership in the PC(USA)” survey conducted by the Research Services office of our denomination, with request to share with the church Sessions

Report of the Presbytery Council

March 6, 2019 Meeting:

- Presbytery Council Approved a motion instructing the Stated Clerk to send a letter in 2019 and subsequently on an annual basis to each of the churches dismissed to ECO since 2013, to confirm compliance with the provision in all dismissal agreements that the dismissed church must stay in ECO for 10 years after dismissal, or in another denomination within a reformed tradition.

- Heard a status report regarding a meeting by three Council members with Session members at Lompoc Presbyterian Church regarding the request for dismissal.
- Heard a report from the Personnel Committee regarding plans for position description and search for a bookkeeper.
- Reviewed letter from the Advocacy Committee for Women's Concerns (ACWC) inviting Councils and leaders to learn about and share the results of the "Gender and Leadership in the PC(USA)" survey conducted by the Research Services office of our denomination. Council approved a motion that the Stated Clerk pass on the letter and survey report to the Clerks of Session to share with Sessions and that the gender survey Report topic be included as an Agenda item for the May 18 Presbytery meeting.

April 3, 2019 Meeting:

- Motion Regarding Designation of El Montecito Dismissal Funds: Council at its April 3 meeting reviewed the topic of designation of the use of funds from the dismissal agreement with El Montecito Presbyterian Church. Presbytery has not yet determined any designation for use of these funds. A **motion** for specific distributions of a portion of El Montecito Dismissal Funds was approved by Council to recommend approval by Presbytery at the May 18, 2019 Presbytery meeting, as follows:

That, from the original down payment amount of \$350,000, in dismissal funds from El Montecito Presbyterian Church, specific distributions shall be paid, as follows:

- *A one-time tithe (\$36,000) to be divided between the following recipients:*
 - *IMPACT - \$12,000*
 - *Mission Conference - \$12,000*
 - *Front Porch - \$12,000*
 - ***Council recommends this motion to Presbytery for approval at the May 18, 2019 Presbytery Meeting.***
- Council received a report from the Treasurer regarding designated funds. All designated funds from the first 3 months of 2019 have been paid out as designated. The auditors are preparing the 2017 and 2018 audits for UMB and for the Presbytery. The audits, when completed, will determine the status of the designated funds for prior years. The accounts payable designated funds will then be disbursed (as soon as the Balance Sheet is brought current.)
 - Council reviewed a letter from the Session of the Lompoc Presbyterian Church regarding the dismissal process and approved proceeding with a letter response.
 - Regarding the Front Porch Task Force, Council approved a motion for collaboration by the CDC, Front Porch Task Force and Front Porch Council to develop a policy that defines the relationship between Front Porch and the

Presbytery, including operating practices, with CDC, COM, Property & Finance and Personnel Committees.

- Received a report from the Planning Team of the input from the Feb. 9 Presbytery meeting lunchtime discussions, and plans to review staffing options in a joint meeting with the Personnel Committee and Property & Finance Committee.
- Council assigned the Personnel Committee to review the current Presbytery Child Protection and Sexual Misconduct policies, to consider whether updates are needed and to make recommendations to Council.

May 1, 2019 Meeting

- Presbytery Council received and reviewed the Presbytery Profit/Loss Report through March 2019.
- Council approved forming a Presbytery Response Team for Lompoc Presbyterian Church.
- Council welcomed Rev. Dan Stevens, Chair of the Planning Team. Council members gave feedback to the Planning Team regarding staffing planning questions and related financial topics.
- Reviewed a Matthew 25 Invitation and information from the Presbyterian Mission Agency, and referred this to the Church in the World (Missions) Committee for review.
- Council approved the Recommendation from the Stated Clerk regarding parity at Presbytery meetings between Teaching Elder members and Ruling Elder commissioners at Presbytery meeting. The Recommendation will be for Presbytery approval at the May 18, 2019 Presbytery Meeting.
