Coastal Community Church

One of our traditions here at Coastal Community is called "Change for a Dollar." Every other week we pass around a bucket during worship, inviting the folks to drop in spare change and bills (over their normal tithes and offerings). Then someone volunteers to take the bucket and



bless someone in need here in the Five Cities. And they come back the next week to share the experience. This is one of those stories.

Trinity Coghill's family was one of those invited. On Good Friday, the last day before spring break, Trinity's grandmother Lonnie was talking to the school crossing guard. She said, "Isn't it great to have a break next week!?" The crossing guard said, "Actually, no. If I don't work, I don't get paid, and I need the money to fix the brakes on my car." She needed her car to drive to Los Osos several times a week to care for her daughter, who was recovering from a brain injury.

Trinity's grandmother shared this need with her family. They decided the Lord was leading them to give whatever was collected in worship on Easter Sunday to the crossing guard to make her car safe. \$280 was in the bucket, just enough to repair the front brakes. That week, Trinity and her family visited the crossing guard gave her the money, explaining where it was from.

The crossing guard was deeply grateful and brought her car to the repair shop. When they lifted her car up on the rack and inspected her brake pads.... he said "You must have been stopped by prayer- because it sure wasn't your brakes!"
