Many people believe that the word "love" is one of the sweetest in the English language.

To some, love makes the world go around. Some say love is a many-splendored thing.

It's the answer to our greatest questions, and the key to every door.

Love is the only thing that can make life worth living. Songwriters and poets never tire of telling its charms.

And yet, in spite of the oceans of ink that have been poured out on account of love, our world seems more mystified by it than ever.

We dream; we cling; we weep over loves lost and love never found.

But love doesn't have to be such a mystery.

The Bible has told us that the essence of love is not in what we receive, but in what we give.
