### O1

#### Acts 1:1-8

In week 1, Pastor Rob shared with us a message out of Acts chapter 1. Focusing in on Acts 1:8, we are commanded, called, and commissioned to be witnesses! Witnesses to the greatest miracle, story, and invitation ever.

Acts 1:8 - *“But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”*

#### Acts 1:9-26

In week 2, Pastor Ryan shared with us a message closing out Acts chapter 1. Highlighting that our awe of God should outweigh our desire for sin or self-advancement. John 3:30 says, “He must increase and I must decrease.

Philippians 2:13 - *“for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose.”*

1. In Acts 1, Judas was “counted as one of the disciples who shared in the ministry”, yet he ultimately betrayed Jesus. What do you think are some reasons he chose to do that instead of following all he’d heard and seen from Jesus?
2. What are some things that we can do to develop our awe for God and help us to choose things that please Him?

### O3

#### Acts 2:1-13

In week 3, Pastor Matt challenged us out of Acts 2 that a Spirit-led life isn’t about doing more for God, but about staying aligned with the Holy Spirit and choosing our best yes instead of our busiest life. When we live led by the Spirit, our lives bring fire, clarity, and life... not quiet exhaustion.

Galatians 5:25 - *“Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.”*

1. What are some “good” things in our lives that might be keeping us from being truly Spirit-led right now?
2. If every yes is a no to something else, what is one yes we may need to rethink so our lives better reflect the Holy Spirit’s guidance?
