The Pastor Speaks

I am a Carmelite Catholic Missionary priest. As I complete two years in this parish as pastor, I acknowledge the following in our parish.

Our Corpus Christi parish church is ten years old and our Corpus Christi parish community had its humble beginning in two schools over twenty years ago. I am the fifth Pastor during these twenty years after Rev. Fathers Martin Carroll, Jim Corrigan, Joseph Vadassery, Shimit Abraham CFIC and then myself.

I thank God for all the parishioners who value and love the Church. Parishioners are proud of our church building, seating arrangements, baptismal font, parking lot, parish hall, Eucharistic Adoration chapel and the choirs and ministers during liturgy. They offer their time, energy, expertise and wealth, freely for the glory of God and for the good of the parish.

Yes, we have a beautiful spacious church and campus with plenty of parking spaces, and we are a welcoming parish. I am happy to be part of this parish community.

Let us thank God for the formation He gave to our pioneers during those more than ten years when they were offering Holy Mass in schools, the inspiration God gave them to think of a new parish community and the enthusiasm with which they raised the initial funds.

I acknowledge and appreciate the selfless service of the office staff, maintenance department, clergy and religious in the parish administration. With gratitude, I remember Fr. Joseph Aipe CMI, and I welcome Fr. Rijo Jose CMI to our parish. I appreciate the commitment and consultation offered by parish leadership and different committees. I recognize the co-operation and the timely contributions of all the choir groups, the choirs of children and youth. We have 22 choirs and their leaders and other groups who support and help the liturgy and the administration of the Sacraments.

I highly value all volunteers and the committed service you offer for the glory of God and for the good of the parish. Our church is kept clean and the grounds and parking lot are well maintained. The church is well arranged and decorated according to each season. The dedication of our Finance Committee and the Count Room personnel assists in the financial administration of the parish. This parish moves forward very smoothly because of the helpful efforts of all volunteers.

The different formation programs in the parish: Catechism, Children's Liturgy, Legion of Mary, RCIA, RCIC, preparation for the Sacraments, the involvement of the Couples for Christ and Young Adults Ministry make our parish very special and unique. I am also grateful to the RVM Sisters for their dedicated role in

pastoral formation.

The Catholic atmosphere in our schools provided by the school leadership and teaching and non-teaching staff is praiseworthy. Parents, even from other religious backgrounds, feel very confident in our schools.

Our Pastoral Care volunteers who help at the Grey Nuns Community Hospital, Allen Grey Continuing Care, Laurel Heights Retirement Residence, those who work and visit the other hospitals and those who administer Holy Communion at home, bring comfort and blessings to the sick and the aged in our parish.

The blessings, prayers, and greetings for those celebrating wedding anniversaries and birthdays, blessings for children and Sunday catechism add more beauty and uniqueness to our parish community and its faith formation.

All the above-mentioned activities of our parishioners make our parish active, vibrant, service minded, pastorally oriented and a welcoming parish community.

I find words are inadequate to express my gratitude for what you offer for the church and for the way the parishioners benefit from your dedication, commitment and volunteering services which help us reduce our expenses. Your efforts give witness to the Stewardship Prayer which we recite during weekend Masses.

This parish is blessed with many associations. We host different liturgical activities and meetings coupled with different cultural backgrounds, such as Simbang Gabi, Santo Niño, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe and others.

I acknowledge the generous efforts of the different fundraising activities in the parish, namely the annual Golf Tournament, Taste of India, monthly samosa sales, gift card sales, Religious Articles Store sales, the various activities of the Catholic Women's League, Knights of Columbus and of all other special groups and events, which raise funds for the church. I feel very happy to observe the enthusiasm and the competitive spirit with which you all involve yourselves in all fundraising activities and how generously parishioners and friends of Corpus Christi respond towards the needs of the parish. I feel proud of you all and happy to be part of this parish and of its efforts to pay off the mortgage of the church. Parishioners respond generously towards these fundraising activities, according to their needs and tastes.

Parishioners are also happy and ready to volunteer to remove snow, church cleaning and care for our landscaping so that we reduce expenses and save funds for mortgage.

I observe that, each fundraising activity of the church, is very timely originated to address the needs of the

church for funds. Each has its own place to fit in the entire life of the church as parishioners offer helping hands freely and respond positively to support financially their efforts. Though I have not started them, I support whole heartedly and join in part with each of our fundraising events.

Many of these activities happen in our Gathering Space, so sometimes there might arise a feeling that it is like a marketplace. However, this is why we have this special open area to bring the activities in the parish to the parishioners.

This church is blessed to have a parish hall with all the facilities on the same floor. It helps to have the hall for overflow seating, for the Palm Sunday gathering before the procession, special Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and other celebrations.

Five-year Mortgage plan – 2026 to 2032 . . . I came to be aware that the pioneering parishioners who, with the leadership of Fr. Jim Corrigan, began to raise funds for the Church project. To find the \$16 million, they kicked off the first Five-year mortgage plan and realized over \$6 million in initial funds. Then they received a mortgage of \$10 million, which was to be paid in fifteen years. I understand that Corpus Christi, in its initial stages, received building fund donations from members of other parishes. I am very grateful to all of them.

Secondly, there was a three-year Charitable Commitment Campaign for the mortgage under the leadership of Fr. Shimit Abraham CFIC. At present we stand at \$4.16 million.

As a third phase, we have kick-started another Five-year mortgage plan to completely pay off our mortgage by the due date of December 31, 2032. I appeal to all parishioners to put our hands together towards this goal.

This five-year contribution for the Mortgage should not be an extra expense for you, but rather, each of us should find this money from our different sacrifices and mortifications each day, from the entire family. Such sacrifices, touching the hearts of all family members will help us to tell our younger generation (children, grandchildren, great grandchildren), that we all contributed toward this Church and how we found the funds.

As I acknowledge the strength of our parish, during our Ten-year anniversary, we need to look into some areas of our church activities and evaluate them.

Our church needs more lay faithful to help with the different sacramental preparations, such as Infant Baptism, First Holy Communion, Sacrament of Confirmation, RCIA and RCIC in the parish. Sunday Catechism also needs more helping hands. I

encourage our parishioners who have received sacraments in the Catholic Church, according to their state of life, to come forward to support this need in the church. Those interested may contact the Parish Office.

Lateness to Holy Mass and leaving early before the recessional are important areas which we all need to look at very seriously. Parents coming to church late and leaving early might give a wrong liturgical discipline to your children. I request with all to come early, find some time for personal prayer, take part in the Holy Mass until after the Recessional Procession and then leave the church. Early leaving the church, sometimes blocks the recession and creates some confusion. Set good example for / before the young ones in your families, and in the church. Include your children for the special blessings for children.

Parents need to encourage their children to receive different sacraments regularly, and bring them for regular confessions, parents need to lead them by example. I encourage parents to make use of the Sunday catechism for their children.

To the parents of young children, thank you for bring your children to church. Don't get discouraged, if your children cry or run up and down. That is the beauty of a growing church; yes, the church is growing. You know your child best and when to move to the cry room as they begin to become unsettled.

To those parents, who stay in the gathering space with their children, don't make that space a playground for your children, allowing them to run up and down with understanding that for some of our children, this is a difficult task. Teaching them over time as they grow, will give them an understanding of the church.

I notice also, some children bringing toys to the church. Parents should educate the children to leave the toys in the car and enter the church. My question to them is when your children go to school, do they carry those toys to the classrooms? Parents, please impart to your children from their younger days, the meaning and benefits of prayer, the church, sacraments, and different liturgical gatherings in the church. Avoid eating and drinking in the church. Enter the church and Nave with proper disposition, so that we avoid going out from the nave during Holy Mass.

Let us gather together, worship together, pray together and serve together. Everything else will be given to us, to our families, to our parish. Jesus told his disciples, **“Seek first His Kingdom and His Righteousness, and everything else will be given to you as well”** (Mt. 6.33). **Amen.**

NEW ALBERTA HEALTH SERVICES PROTOCOLS FOR CLERGY HOSPITAL VISITS

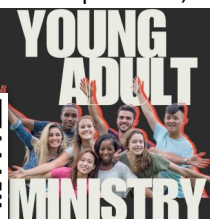
Due to FOIP related protocol amendments with Alberta Health Services (AHS), patients in hospital must be **registered as Catholic and have digitally signed consent** to receive visits from their faith community coordinated by Spiritual Health Practitioners. If the patient is unable to sign, a family member may do so on their behalf. Without signed consent, the in-hospital Spiritual Health Practitioner cannot contact the clergy on-call.

Regardless of the new AHS protocols, patients and families may still make private arrangements for a priest/deacon to visit.

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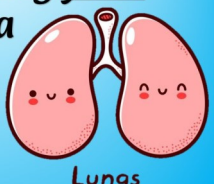
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
