MORNING WORSHIP

The Epistle of Joy – **Philippians 1:1-11**

This letter is Paul's "Letter of Joy." His most warmly of his 13 books of the Bible.

He wrote the letter while in his first Roman imprisonment in AD 60-62.

Paul had some initial difficulties with the city of Philippi when he visited.

Acts 16:10-40 – this was during Paul's second missionary journey with Silas. Paul meets Timothy on this missionary journey.

- Philippi was the first church in Europe. He visited there in AD 49-50.
- Lydia, a dealer in purple cloth, was the first convert.
- Paul and Silas are beaten and thrown into jail because Paul set a fortune-telling slave girl free.
- While in jail at midnight, there's an earthquake and the doors were opened – the Philippian jailer was about to kill himself, but he got saved and baptized instead, all at night.
- Paul received orders to leave the town, but he revealed that he and Silas were Roman citizens. The magistrates then escorted them out of the town.

The planting, growth and endurance of the church in the city of Philippi is the Gospel advancing deeply into the Roman Empire – the city has historical connections with Alexander the Great and Caesar Augustus.

What is going on?

- The church at Philippi sent Epaphroditus to help Paul in Rome, while in prison. They sent a gift, perhaps food and supplies. Along the way, Epaphroditus became sick and almost died. Paul commended Epaphroditus and sent this letter home with him.
- The epistle of joy is a thank you letter, it updates his status in Rome, it lets them know that Timothy is coming soon, and addresses internal tension within the church.
