How to Maintain Joy – **Philippians 1:12-20**

Paul is preaching to heavily populated cities such as Philippi, Thessalonica, Corinth, and Athens. He has a great desire to preach Christ in Rome, it is the capital and most important city in the empire.

Paul visited Rome as a prisoner. He was arrested in Jerusalem and sent to stand trial before Caesar. (**Acts 25:10-12**)

Despite his imprisonment, Paul remained confident in the spread of the Gospel. He did this by staying focused on the following:

- God's mission was being accomplished. **v. 12**
- People, including guards and prisoners, were hearing the Gospel. **v. 13**
- People were sharing Paul's letters and sharing their testimonies with others. Paul would lead someone to Christ, and they would share their faith. **v. 14**

Paul's imprisonment in Rome served as a base for mission activity. He didn't allow his present situation to stop him.

When you're discouraged, ask yourselves these questions:

- Is Jesus the Lord of your life? If so, rejoice.
- Are you looking forward to heaven?
- Do you know of someone worse off than you?

While in prison, Paul was aware of the danger of jealousy and envy. It did not bother Paul that others were praised, promoted and more recognized than himself. His purpose was to see people saved.

- He was in prison out of God's sovereign will and not out of any disobedience or unfaithfulness.

- The Lord used Paul's imprisonment to guard and advance Paul's mission work. Many people wanted to kill Paul, yet God used Roman imprisonment as his safest place.
