**Blind Bartimaeus Sees Jesus**

**Mark 10:46-52**

Before Jesus entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, He was in Jericho and heard a man crying out to Him. Jesus is headed to Jerusalem to die and He stopped to heal a blind man.

Bartimaeus' eyes are opened and he sees Jesus first. After we close our eyes at death, we open them in heaven to see Jesus first.

The crowd tried to quiet Bartimaeus, but he cried out more. His response is an example to us.

When Jesus called Bartimaeus - He threw off his coat, jumps up, and comes to Jesus. **v. 50**

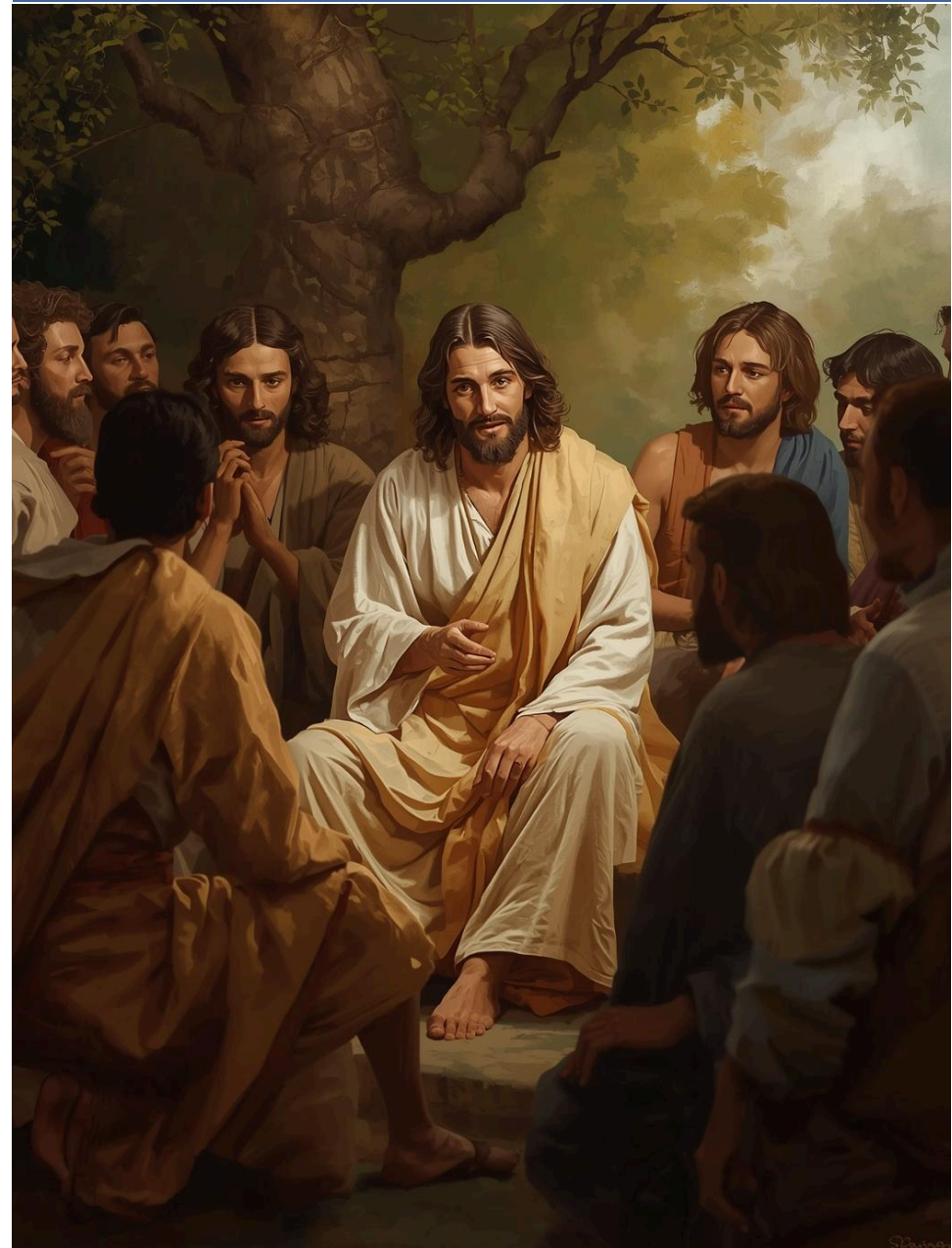

## MORNING WORSHIP

### **The God Who Can** **Philippians 4:10-23**

"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13 NKJV

Paul isn't saying while he's in prison, "I can break these chains, beat up the guards, and run out of this prison through Christ who strengthens me."

Paul is saying that he is content with every situation that faces him because Christ strengthens him.

We're not to be preoccupied with our circumstances, rather we're to be preoccupied with Jesus. We don't minimize our pain, rather we maximize Christ.

Many Christians struggle with:

- Treasuring Christ more than anything.
- Remaining content in Christ.

Our culture teaches us the opposite. We're told to treasure our needs and "if only" we had something we'd be content.

- Christian contentment is believing Christ is enough. If someone has blessed you, thank God for them - in front of them.
- Contentment should be unconnected to our circumstances. It is harder to be content in abundance than in need.

Contentment makes believers flexible, able to go anywhere, and do anything. It's a "no limits" attitude. This drives missions, spiritual gifts and our ability to go through unfortunate circumstances.

Christians aren't customers of the Lord, we're co-laborers with Christ - content in our situation, trusting the results with God.

**Takeaway:** Contentment is the key that unlocks treasuring Christ. Believers can treasure Jesus in all circumstances.
